TRANSHIPMENT INTERSESSIONAL WORKING GROUP (TS-IWG) CO-CHAIR'S REPORT TO TCC19

Issued: 22 September 2023

The TS-IWG co-chairs are pleased to report to TCC19 that the Transshipment Information Analysis (TIA) was completed earlier this year and discussed among members at the most recent TS-IWG in May 2023 (TSIWG01). TSIWG01 took note of the discussion paper focused on the initial points of Phase 3 of the TIA but was unable to discuss it during the meeting. No additional feedback on the initial points of Phase 3 have been received and the co-Chairs would welcome further discussion if desired by members. All papers related to the work of the group, including all meeting reports and Secretariat annual reports are available on the <u>TS-IWG page of the WCPFC website</u>.

The TIA, TS-IWG May 2023 meeting (and supporting documents) provided the data and discussion needed for the TS-IWG to chip away at, and potentially achieve, the first of its two objectives identified in TS-IWG Terms of Reference (TOR, paragraph 4):

• Assess CMM 2009-06's scope and effectiveness in regulating and monitoring transshipment activity in a manner consistent with the Convention, and

With the first TOR objective as the benchmark of understanding among members, the TS-IWG has not yet initiated or embarked on the TOR second objective (TOR, paragraph 4):

• Recommend amendments or other actions, if any, related to CMM 2009-06 to improve the regulation and monitoring of transshipment activities.

The TS-IWG Co-Chairs would like to work with TS-IWG members to achieve both objectives before WCPFC20, such that any TS-IWG recommendations can be considered by the Commission and CMM 2009-06 potentially revised in Rarotonga, Cook Islands in December 2023.

TO that end, the TS-IWG co-Chairs have developed a simple table based on the recommendations from the TIA and the May 2023 virtual working group meeting (Attachment A). This table will provide the prioritization framework for developing potential draft CMM text and recommendations from the TS-IWG. The initial input in the table is a starting point for confirming members' priorities. The co-chairs seek additional input during TCC19 for development of specific text before WCPFC20. All discussion and revision of text will be by email correspondence between TCC19 and WCPFC20.
