The Western and Central Pacific Ocean is home to the biggest tuna fishery in the world. It is arguably one of the best managed. Stocks of all three tropical tunas and north and south Pacific albacore are 'in the green,' that is, not overfished and not subject to overfishing. Adopting harvest strategies, also called management procedures, will ensure these fisheries remain healthy, within a target range and profitable for future generations.
