

Update on TCC priority work items (TCC Workplan 2022-24)

WCPFC20-2023-34 4 December 2023

Prepared by the TCC Chair

- The TCC Workplan 2022-24 includes twenty-three Project priority specific tasks, in addition to TCC Priority core business tasks.
- Since the workplan was adopted, many of the Project priority specific tasks have progressed to the point of transitioning into standard work items for the Secretariat.
- Some tasks have been delayed for various reasons, most notably competing priorities.
- At TCC19, the TCC Chair undertook to prepare advice to WCPFC20 on the progress of work in the TCC workplan. To this end, a status update table is provided here for the information of WCPFC20. A "traffic light" approach has been taken to give a simple overview of status of work.
 - Green for work completed or progressing as expected.
 - Orange for where work is underway but there have been delays.
 - Red for where work is not progressing at this stage.

Some additional explanatory comments/updates to text are provided (red text is new text compared to what is in the TCC Workplan 2022-24).

- This update is not intended to indicate priority of work, nor provide the basis for discussion on the merits of the agreed project priority tasks. Simply to indicate where TCC has and has not made progress, to inform future planning for the Committee.
- The TCC workplan also includes a list of Commission and TCC Intersessional working groups. Working groups that have ceased or are inactive are identified in this update paper with strikethrough text.

- With a number of project priority tasks having transitioned into ongoing/routine work for the Secretariat, a number of the specific tasks could be consolidated, potentially into a separate section for "ongoing tasks".
- As discussed at TCC19, with a number of key decision items on the WCPFC20 agenda that could substantially affect the agenda of TCC20 –including the expiry of the CMS CMM, the list of obligations, ongoing work to enhance Secretariat analytical capability, consideration of a revised transhipment proposal– it would be difficult to prepare a comprehensive revision of the TCC Workplan.
- However, with the information provided in this update, along with the decisions to be made and the expected workload for the Secretariat and Chair arising from related issues being considered at this Commission meeting, it would be prudent to prepare a revised and consolidated version of the TCC Workplan (for 2024 at least) early in the new year. This updated workplan would then be used to inform planning towards TCC20.
- Hence, WCPFC20 is invited to:
 - Note the information provided in this status update, and
 - Task the TCC Chair to develop an updated and consolidated TCC Workplan for 2024 to inform planning for TCC20, for circulation to CCMs in the first quarter of 2024.
