

Proposed Interim Allocation Arrangement for High seas PS effort limit

Twentieth Regular Session of the Commission (WCPFC20)

Background

○ para. 27 of CMM 2021-01 : The Commission will commence a process to develop that framework in 2022, to enable the Commission to reach agreement in 2023 on hard effort or catch limits in the high seas of the Convention Area and a framework for the allocation of limits in the high seas amongst all Members those and **<u>Participating Territories</u>** that adequately take into account Articles 8, 10 (3) and 30 of the Convention.

Background

An interim allocation arrangement which may serve as a bridging or transition measure until the Commission reaches agreement on the allocation frame work

Does not preclude the process to develop an allocation framework that the Commission Chair is proposing

10,000 days

- Introduced in TTMW4 as DP04
- SKJ MP HCR scalar 1.0 = PS effort at 2012 levels
- Total PS effort in 2012 average `19~`21 EEZ days = HS days

WCPFC-TTMW4-2023-IP05, Table 1 PNA EEZs excluding AWs : (41,883+2,318) – 33,452 = **10,749** Total EEZs excluding AWs, ID/PH : (43,926+2,451) – 34,715 = **11,662**

Any information on the number of EEZ days for future years? Some consideration needs to be given to yellowfin tuna

Historical HS PS effort by CCM

WCPFC-TTMW4-2023-IP05, Figure 10



Certain CCMs fishing opportunities decreased sharply while some other CCMs fished without limit. Unfair

Proposed Interim Allocation Arrangement – high level principle

- Two groups of CCMs
- Group A : CCMs with limits 10 CCMs
- Group B : CCMs with no limit and the Philippines 10 CCMs
- The same number of days for each group
- Special considerations for American Samoa and CCMs with small purse seine fleets of five vessels or less, etc.

Proposed Interim Allocation Arrangement – details

• Other value of CCM effort such as "average" may be considered instead of "highest" if CCMs prefer

• The two groups may consider taking different approaches in allocating the total number of days available to each group, as appropriate

• CNMs would be eligible for the high seas purse seine effort limit subject to participatory rights

• An average level of HS PS effort per vessel in recent years could be the limit for a new CCM or vessel – existing CCMs' limits would need to be adjusted proportionally
