Prepared by the TCC Chair and Secretariat

This document provides the TCC Workplan 2022 – 2024, and includes focused on work for this year, including in relation to matters that have been included in the TCC20 Provisional Agenda. The updates included herein include:

- work across a number of key issues which is ably led by the chairs of a number of intersessional working groups – in particular work on developing electronic monitoring standards, developing a CMM for labour standards, and integrating climate change considerations into the work of the Commission,
- significant work reported to TCC19 which is being undertaken by the Secretariat to improve the Commission's analytical capabilities and strengthen the monitoring programmes, including on data available to verify compliance and supporting science-based management, and
- consideration of some discussions between the Commission Chair, the SC Chair and TCC Chair, with the Secretariat, related to how we can better integrate the work of the subsidiary bodies with the work of the Commission.

The TCC20 Provisional Agenda proposes time early in TCC20 for a discussion on the workplan. With the number of key issues that are expected to make progress at TCC20 and WCPFC21, it is expected that there will be a body of work for the TCC Chair and Vice Chair and Secretariat to undertake following TCC20 and in the lead up to the Commission meeting in Fiji in December.

- a. Monitor and review compliance with conservation and management measures and other obligations stemming from the Convention.
- b. Assessment of IUU fishing vessel nominations and review of fishing vessels currentlyon the IUU list
- c. Review of Cooperating Non-Member applications.
- d. Monitor obligations relating to Small Island Developing States and territories.
- e. Review the implementation of cooperative measures for monitoring, control, surveillance and enforcement adopted by the Commission and make such recommendations to the Commission as may be necessary.
- f. Review Annual report(s) of the WCPFC Secretariat, which should address relevant technical and compliance issues, which may include HSBI, ROP, VMS, RFV, Data Rules, transshipment, port State measures, and note the Executive Director's report onthese matters, the Secretariats anticipated forecast of work commitments for TCC, and other issues as appropriate.
- g. Provide technical and compliance-related advice to support the development of harveststrategies, including consideration of the implications of harvest control rules.
- h. Review the ongoing work of the Intersessional Working Groups (IWG) noted in Section 3.
- i. Review information about technical and compliance matters arising under existing CMMs.
- j. Make technical and compliance related comments on proposed CMMs.
