Dear Northern Committee Members,

Please find attached a letter from the new Co-Chair of the Joint IATTC and WCPFC-NC Working Group reporting the outcomes of the 102nd IATTC meeting on Pacific bluefin tuna. I am pleased to welcome Mr. Josh Madeira, Director of Policy and Stakeholder Engagement at Monterey Bay Aquarium, Monterey, California, USA, as the Co-Chair of the JWG. We look forward to continuing active collaboration between the IATTC and WCPFC in managing Pacific bluefin tuna fisheries in the Pacific Ocean.

In his letter, Co-Chair Madeira highlights the recent adoption of Pacific bluefin tuna-related Resolutions by the IATTC and requests whether WCPFC-NC members would consider any technical amendments to the newly proposed Conservation and Management Measure for Monitoring, Control, and Surveillance of Pacific Bluefin Tuna. These amendments would align with Resolution <u>C-24-03</u> (Monitoring and Control Measures for the Bluefin Tuna Fishery in the EPO).

Considering this, I intend to convene a short online NC meeting to discuss adjustments to the outcomes of NC20 (Attachment E, <u>NC20 Summary Report</u>) from the July meeting in response to the recent IATTC decisions. RE: Outcomes of the 102nd IATTC meeting relating to Pacific bluefin tuna

Dear Co-Chair Miyahara,

It is a pleasure to commence working with you in my new role as the IATTC Co-Chair of the Joint IATTC and WCPFC-NC Northern Committee (NC) Working Group on the Management of Pacific bluefin tuna (JWG). I would like to report on the outcomes relating to Pacific bluefin tuna at the recent 102nd meeting of the IATTC hosted by Panama from 02 September to 06 September 2024.

The IATTC:

- Adopted C-24-02, Measures for the Conservation and Management of Pacific bluefin tuna in the Eastern Pacific Ocean. This resolution amended the catch limits and related measures for 2025 2026, consistent with the recommendations provided by the JWG in July 2024.
- Adopted C-24-03, On Monitoring and Control Measures for the bluefin tuna fishery in the EPO. This resolution included provisions covering monitoring and control measures for Pacific bluefin tuna fisheries, farming operations, review and instructions to establish a catch documentation scheme.

To ensure transparency and understanding by all JWG member nations, I respectfully call your attention to the language in C-24-03 that contains some additional detail and provisions that were not included in the JWG recommendations from July 2024 - please see Annex G of the Chair's Summary of the 9th IATTC and WCPFC NC Joint Working Group on the Management of Pacific bluefin tuna that outlines a new Conservation and Management Measure (CMM) for Monitoring, Control and Surveillance (MCS) of Pacific bluefin tuna in the WCPFC.

Given the intent of the JWG to encourage consistent measures for Pacific bluefin tuna across both RFMOs, it may be advisable for WCPFC-NC members to consider if any technical amendments to their MCS measures (Annex G) are necessary and appropriate.
