- DP11 SPA CMM for Management Procedure (scheduled for adoption at WCPFC21) separate presentation
- DP12 A second CMM that will define the management arrangements to implement that MP (scheduled for 2025) – this presentation
 - A new measure that replaces CMM 2015-02
- The SPA MP CMM will set a TAC but will not have details for how this will be achieved (allocation, limits etc.)

Guiding Principles



- 1. Applies in EEZs and high seas throughout the range of the stock in the WCPF-CA.
- 2. Reflects current best understanding of SPA science and its assessed status.
- 3. Prevents further decreases in vulnerable biomass in order to sustain/improve catch rates and support improving economic conditions for SIDS domestic fleets and national fisheries.
- 4. Accommodates subregional zone-based management approaches and limits and ensures compatible management and limits on the high seas.
- 5. Recognises the sovereign rights of coastal States to explore, exploit, conserve and manage highly migratory species within areas under their national jurisdiction.
- 6. Recognises the special requirements of, and avoids transferring a disproportionate burden of conservation upon, SIDS and Participating Territories.

Components of the implementing arrangement CMM



- Applies to all WCPF-CA SPA fisheries south of the equator including IATTC overlap area
- This CMM is to achieve required catch levels from the MP
- Allocations and management tools to be determined
- There is a need to consider interannual variability and subregional catch reconciliation
- Consideration of the impacts of SPA catch levels in the EPO

Management measures



- Full catch retention of all SPA, BET, YFN
 - Discards only for a full hold on last set or depredation
 - Discarding only undertaken with observer or EM verification
- Sovereign rights of coastal States to determine how some of these management measures will be applied in their waters, or to apply additional or more stringent measures

Monitoring requirements



- Electronic reporting of operational catch and effort data (logsheets) to the Commission including discards reporting requirements.
- 100% unloadings data to be (electronically) collected and reported to the Commission.
- Minimum 5% observer coverage of fishing vessels in areas where allocation applies. Electronic Monitoring may be applied if/when appropriate.
- Any vessels transshipping albacore must have 100% observer coverage on carrier vessels. This may include EM if required information for transshipment notification/declaration can be verified (e.g. volume of fish transferred and species can be effectively monitored).

Reporting



• CCMs will report annually to the WCPFC Secretariat at SC, TCC, and the annual Commission meeting

- Initial comments and suggestions to be discussed at WCPFC21
- WCPFC21 task the SPA-IWG progress the implementing arrangement for the SPA MP in 2025
- WCPFC22 work to adopt this implementing arrangement at the end of 2025
