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ANNUAL REPORT ON THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE WCPFC DATA ACCESS RULES AND PROCEDURES

WCPFC-TCC21-2025-RP08

25 August 2025

Purpose

1. This paper provides an update on WCPFC's non-scientific data holdings and their administration by the Secretariat.

Introduction

2. The rules categorising data as public or non-public and the administration of such data is governed by the [Rules and Procedures for the Protection, Access to, and Dissemination of Data Compiled by the Commission](#) (2007 data RaP).
3. Additional rules for non-scientific data holdings are in the [Rules and Procedures for the Protection, Access to, and Dissemination of High Seas Non-Public Domain Data and Information Compiled by the Commission for the Purpose of Monitoring, Control or Surveillance \(MCS\) Activities and the Access to and Dissemination of High Seas VMS Data for Scientific Purposes](#) (2009 MCS data RaP). A summary of non-scientific data holdings is in **Annex 1**.¹
4. Summary details of data requests approved in 2024 are available to CCMs | [List of CCMs non-public domain data request received and actioned by the Secretariat](#). The list includes filters that allow users to view data by request type and time period.

Access to WCPFC data holdings

Accessing public and non-public domain data

5. Access to public domain data is through the WCPFC webpages and more recently via Application Programming Interfaces (APIs), where possible. Certain data requests, such as scientific data, are handled on a case-by-case basis when the information is not available on the WCPFC website.

6. The Secretariat has an established process for reviewing and deciding on case-by-case requests for access to non-public domain data. All approved data request review forms, related correspondence, and records of data released are maintained in the WCPFC Information Management System (IMS).
7. Secure WCPFC webpages that are accessible only to CCMs provide details of each CCM's Official Contacts, as maintained by the respective Party Administrator. This information is an important way for the Secretariat to verify the authority of individuals requesting access to non-public domain data. **It is therefore important that CCMs ensure their contact information is kept up to date to avoid potential delays in processing data requests.** The Secretariat will contact any authorities to verify the person requesting access where the person is not known.
8. The Secretariat recognises the need to improve the management of data requests, including timely access to data. VMS data has been available for several years via a Trackwell API. The Secretariat now has an established API for access to transshipment data, reducing the need for manual data extraction and emailing of spreadsheets.
9. In response to an SC20 meeting outcome,² the Secretariat updated the [Guidelines for the Template for SC Project Proposals](#) in 2025 so that proponents of SC research projects can include information about the WCPFC datasets they are expected to be accessed to support the project. There is also a new section that allows the WCPFC SSP (SPC-OPF), where possible, to provide comments on the feasibility of providing the requested data in the specified format. Including this information at the time the Scientific Committee considers whether to approve a research project is expected to enhance transparency around future requests to access non-public domain data for scientific purposes and may also support planning and preparation by the SSP for approved data requests.
10. The Secretariat has been considering opportunities to improve the transparency and efficiency of processing data requests. Two key avenues are being explored: (1) the development of an online facility to support CCMs in requesting access to data and tracking the outcome and consideration of their requests, and (2) the preparation of guidance and helpdesk materials.
11. In 2024, the Secretariat held internal discussions on the basic design of the proposed online facility referenced in the aforementioned paragraph. Planning for its development is expected to proceed once higher-priority initiatives, such as the new Compliance Monitoring Report system and the refresh of the WCPFC website, have been completed.
12. While guidance for CCMs on the procedures for requesting access to non-public domain data is scheduled for completion by the end of 2025, additional guidance materials will also be required to assist users in navigating a proposed new online tool. These materials will support the effective rollout of the proposed online facility. (Refer to [TCC21 Working Paper 22](#))

Who has access to data?

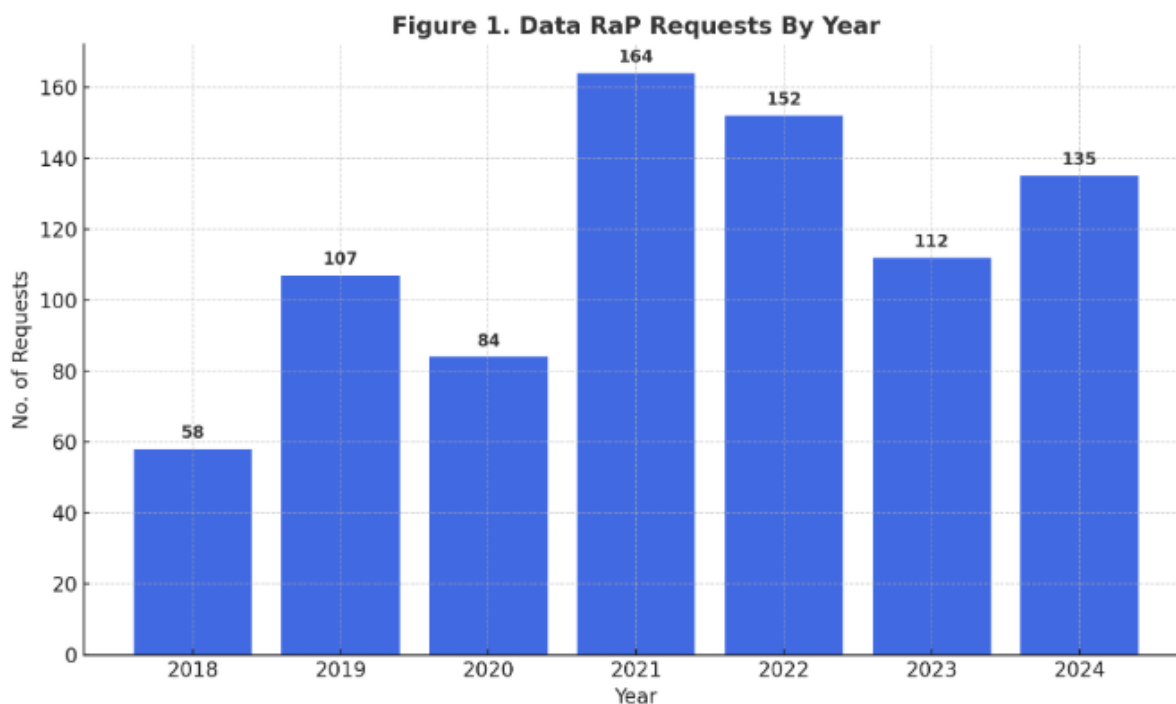
13. The 2007 data RaP categorises those authorised to access WCPFC data where necessary to perform their duties as:
 - a. WCPFC Secretariat and Service Providers authorised by the Executive Director; and
 - b. Officers of the Commission and its subsidiary bodies.

14. The Secretariat maintains a register of access to all WCPFC non-public domain data.³ The register records the Secretariat staff positions, Service Providers, and any other individuals given access to this data (refer to **Annex 2 A**). The Secretariat also maintains records of access to individual Commission systems (refer to **Annex 2 B** for a summary of access during 2024/2025). A list of all CCMs that access the WCPFC VMS system is shown in **Annex 3**.
15. Secretariat staff and individuals working with the Secretariat for short periods, such as interns, are required to sign a confidentiality agreement. Confidentiality provisions are also in the contracts of all WCPFC service providers.

Numbers and types of non-public domain data requests

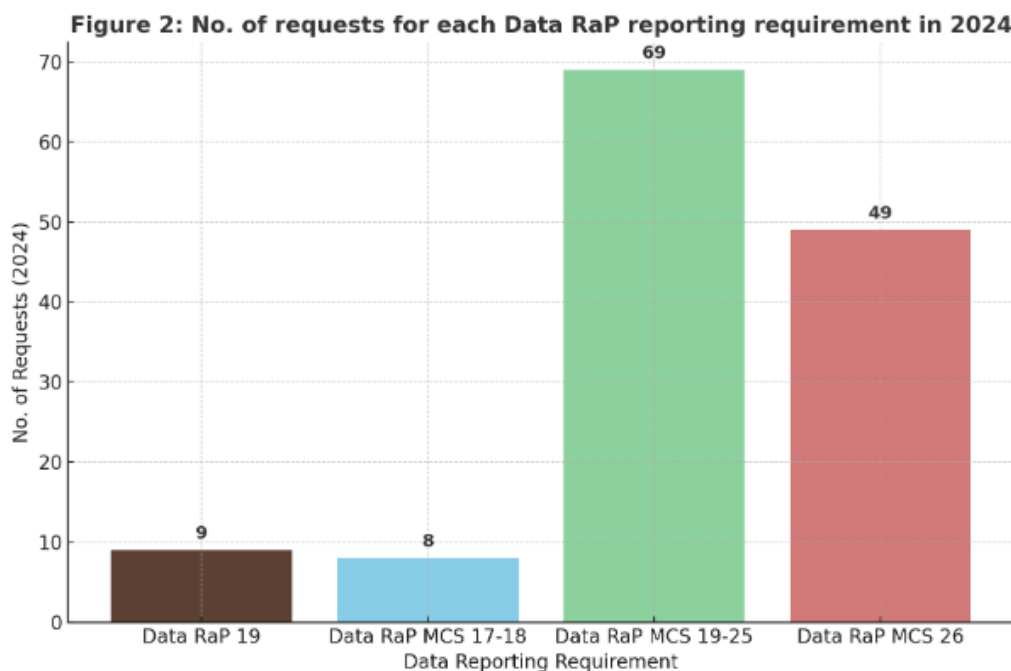
16. **Figure 1** shows that 135 Data RaP requests were approved in 2024, a 20% increase from 112 in 2023. This represents the more stable use of data requests after recovery from the COVID-related low of 84 in 2020, when MCS operations were constrained by port access and restrictions on high seas inspections.
17. Although the 2024 figure remains slightly below the post-COVID peak in 2021 (164) and 2022 (152), the data suggests that volume of requests and the broader scope of data that are requested are now stabilising. This trend indicates a shift by CCMs toward more strategic and risk-based use of data, underpinned by strengthened analytical capacity and operational adjustments developed in response to the challenges of the COVID-19 period.



18. **Figure 2** shows the breakdown of the 135 data requests received in 2024, categorised by reporting requirement. The majority of requests were for:
 - a. Historical and near real-time high seas VMS data (under Data RaP MCS 19–25): 69 requests (51%)

- b. Transshipment reports (under Data RaP MCS 26): 49 requests (36%)
 - c. Access to a CCM's own data (under Data RaP 19): 9 requests (7%)
 - d. High seas boarding and inspection data (under Data RaP MCS 17–18): 8 requests (6%)
19. Compared to 2023 when 112 requests were submitted (59 for VMS data and 45 for transshipment reports), the 2024 data shows both an increase in total volume and shifts in relative demand. While transshipment reports remained a significant focus, accounting for 36% of requests in 2024, this is a slight decline from 45% in 2023, though still above the 30% recorded in 2022.
20. Overall, the continued high proportion of transshipment-related requests highlights ongoing MCS interest in monitoring high seas transshipment activity. The data also suggests growing consistency in the types of information being sought, indicating that CCMs are refining their operational priorities and data needs, particularly in relation to VMS and transshipment data.



21. In its 2024 report on the administration of data rules, the Secretariat noted a rise in requests for high seas vessel activity data during 2023, particularly to support port CCM reviews of entry applications and inspections of foreign flagged vessels. This trend was not observed in 2024. Several of the 2023 requests came from Cooperating Non-Members (CNMs), some of which are signatories to the United Nations Port State Measures Agreement (PSMA). However, these requests were declined in accordance with the MCS Data RaP, which restricts access to non-public domain data for MCS purposes to Commission Members and Participating Territories.⁴
22. In response to this issue raised by CNMs, WCPFC21 tasked the newly established Intersessional Working Group to Review CMM 2017-02 (Port State Minimum Standards) with reviewing the linkage between [CMM 2017-02](#) and MCS data rules in its review of that CMM, including with respect to the potential for CNMs to access MCS data.
