






• Different assumptions to those presented in WCPFC21-2024-30

- Fishing now controlled within southern WCPFC-CA south of 10°S




Commission decisions



- Driven by the mixed fishery framework
 - Captures the inter-related nature of WCPFC fisheries
 - Acts as a tractable approach to managing the four key tuna stocks
 - Avoids 2 MPs controlling the same fishery
 - Has been discussed since SC14/15, WCPFC16 and SMD01
 - Is not 'agreed' but has been Commission-endorsed for evaluation
- WCPFC21 requested parallel development & adoption of SPA and BET MPs within the next 2 years
- Implications highlighted in WCPFC Circular 2025/17 (April)




- Implications for SPA MP managing the Southern LL fishery
- Tropical LL fishery (20°N 10°S) managing BET





- Implications for SPA MP testing
 - Assumptions made for SPA fishing levels in EPO (minus overlap) and WCPFC-CA 0-10°S
- Implications for SPA implementation measure minimal



SPA MP options



- Reduced number of MPs presented to SC21
 - 20 MPs presented to WCPFC21 > 4 MPs to SC21
 - 'Constraint' (limit on change between management periods) had little impact on WCPFC21 MP outcomes
- Results from 4 MPs with a specific constraint presented to SC21
 - MPs developed to achieve one of 3 candidate TRPs under new geographic scope
