### ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE WCPFC RECORD OF FISHING VESSELS

WCPFC-TCC6-2010/13 8 September 2010

### Paper prepared by the Secretariat

#### Introduction

- 1. Conservation and Management Measure 2004-01 (CMM 2004-01), and its replacement CMM 2009-01 requires each WCPFC Member, Cooperating Non-Member and Participating Territory (CCM) to submit to the Executive Director by 1 July 2005 particular information with respect to each vessel listed in its national record of fishing vessels entitled to fly its flag and authorized to fish in the Convention Area beyond its area of national jurisdiction. The information required is details in paragraph 6(a) (r). Since 1 July 2005, each CCM is required to notify the Executive Director within 15 days, or in any case within 72 hours before commencement of fishing activities in the Convention Area of:
  - a. any vessel added to its Record along with the information set forth in paragraph five (5) of Conservation and Management Measure 2004-01;
  - b. any change in the information referred to in paragraph five (5) with respect to any vessel on its Record; and
  - c. any vessel deleted from its Record along with the reason for such deletion in accordance with Article 24(6) of the Convention.
- 2. The Fifth Regular Session of the Commission (WCPFC5) retained the following paragraphs:
  - a. that before 1 July of each year, each Commission Member shall submit to the Executive Director a list of all vessels that appeared in its record of fishing vessels at any time during the preceding calendar year, together with each vessel's registration number, the WCPFC identification number (WIN), and an indication of whether each vessel fished for highly migratory fish stocks in the Convention Area beyond its area of national jurisdiction. The indication shall be expressed as (i) fished, or (ii) did not fish;
  - b. Members that operate, lease or charter arrangements that result in data reporting obligations being conferred to a party other than the flag State will make arrangements to ensure that the flag State can meet its obligations under paragraph 9;
  - c. The Commission shall, in accordance with article 24(7) of the Convention and based on the information provided to the Commission in accordance with the Convention and these procedures, establish and maintain its own record of fishing vessels authorized to fish in the Convention Area beyond the national jurisdiction of the member of the Commission whose flag the vessel is flying. Such record shall be known as the WCPFC Record of Fishing Vessels (the "Record").
  - d. The Record shall include for each vessel an indication of whether or not it was active in the Convention Area beyond its flag State's area of national jurisdiction in each of the preceding years starting in 2007, consistent with the information provided by Members under paragraph 9.
  - e. Since the Fourth Regular Session of the Commission, it has been agreed that the Executive Director shall use available information, including the information supplied by Members under paragraph 9, to assist in the assessment of the implementation of relevant CMMs and resolutions for the annual consideration of the TCC.

- 3. At each Technical and Compliance Committee (TCC) meeting since TCC1 in December 2005 the Secretariat has reported on compliance with CMM 2004-01 and Annex IV of the Convention concerning information provided by CCMs relating to their respective authorized vessels. The reports have traditionally covered the previous year up to the end of August of the current year. The Secretariat's reports have been provided in order to address two objectives:
  - a. rectify anomalies relating to the information required to comply with CMM 2004-01 and Annex IV of the Convention; and
  - b. encourage compliance by CCMs with the submission of all information requirements for each vessel submitted for inclusion on the WCPFC Record of Fishing Vessels (RFV).

### **Status of the WCPFC Record of Fishing Vessels**

- 4. At the time of preparing this paper, 25 CCMs, and three Non-Members (Ecuador, El Salvador, and Indonesia<sup>1</sup>), had submitted 6,111 records of their respective fishing vessels the Executive Director (**Attachment 1**). These cover small, medium and large-scale tuna fishing vessels, vessels targeting tuna and other species, support vessels, and research and training vessels.
- 5. While it has not been possible to verify the information contained in each CCMs' Record of Fishing Vessels, it is clear that not all the information required in CMM 2004-01/CMM 2009-01 has been provided by all of those CCMs that submitted vessel records. **Attachment 2** identifies issues associated with anomalies in the type and quality of information provided by CCMs for their respective vessels. **Attachment 3** provides the percentage compliance by CCMs' with respect to the information they have provided against vessel attributes listed in CMM 2004-01/CMM 2009-01 and reported fishing status (whether each vessel either "fished" or "did not fish" during the period 1 January-31 December 2009).
- 6. During 2010 the Secretariat continued its collaborative work with CCMs to remedy deficiencies in their respective national records of fishing vessels and the Administrative Assistant for Data Entry (AADE) visited three member States (Philippines, Korea, and Vanuatu) to work directly with licensing unit personnel.

### Developments related to the WCPFC Record of Fishing Vessels

Enhancements to the WCPFC Record of Fishing Vessels

- 7. The online, searchable version of the WCPFC Record of Fishing Vessels available at <a href="http://www.wcpfc.int">http://www.wcpfc.int</a> was amended in mid-September 2008 to indicate whether or not a vessel either "fished" or "did not fish" for highly migratory fish stocks in the Convention Area beyond its area of national jurisdiction in the preceding year.
- 8. In order to more efficiently process vessel information provided for the purpose of maintaining the WCPFC Record of Fishing Vessels, WCPFC5 endorsed a TCC4 recommendation that the Secretariat, in consultation with CCMs, develop a web-based system for vessel record information. Such a system was intended to allow CCM flag States to enter the details of vessels for which it is responsible directly to the WCPFC Record of Fishing Vessels. The trial system was completed by mid-August 2009, but very little work has progressed on this initiative to date, due in part to finding constraints.
- 9. The commencement of 2010 saw the amalgamation of the RFV and the Non-Member Register of Carriers and Bunkers, thus cancelling the former Temporary Vessel List.
- 10. The Sixth Regular Session of the Commission set the 'nominal fee' for Non-Member Carriers and Bunkers at US\$2500 (paragraph 200). The allocation of these funds was not decided. The Secretariat is pleased to report that 92 vessels were involved and 12 then reflagged to Members with a total of US\$230,272 in 'nominal fees' being held by the Secretariat. The question remains as to whether this 'nominal fee' is to be a 'one-time fee' or an 'annual fee' for Non-Member Carriers and Bunkers.

Development of the WCPFC Information Management System

11. WCPFC5 endorsed a TCC4 recommendation regarding the development of an information management system (IMS) to support the work of the Commission, under the auspices of the TCC and the Secretariat, to manage information

and data associated with monitoring the implementation of Conservation and Management Measures (CMMs) and other decisions adopted by the Commission, including CMM 2004-01.

- 12. The IMS is now in its first year of trial operations and following recruitment of a new Compliance Officer, Mr. Glenn Jano, the system is being populated with information regarding reporting requirements of CMMs. The system has been used in part to develop reports for TCC6 and will be more effectively utilized 2011 following training of staff as to information required for entry into the system. The IMS will also have the capacity to cater for the data needs of future CMMs or changes in current CMMs. It is intended after the experience of 2011, that the Secretariat will be in the position to offer training to CCMs in the IMS to facilitate the development of their reports for science, compliance and management.
- 13. As of the end of August, the Secretariat has a new AADE, Ms. Jeannie Nanpei, who is entering data on the RFV and Interim Register for Carriers and Bunkers.

### **Advice and Recommendations**

- 14. TCC6 is invited to advise and recommend to the Commission:
  - a. revisions to CMM 2004-01 so that anomalies identified in Attachment 2 are rectified;
  - b. the allocation of the funds collected from the 'nominal fee' for Non-Member Carriers and Bunkers;
  - c. whether the 'nominal fee' is to be a "one-time fee' or an 'annual fee' for Non-Member carriers and Bunkers.
