SUMMARY REPORT ON THE PORJECT HISTORY FUNDED BY JAPANESE TRUST FUND

WCPFC-SC5-2009/GN-IP-12 14 July 2009

Background

The JTF is multi-year programme of support provided by the Government of Japan to be implemented over 5 years starting from 2007 (2007 and 2008 projects were combined for administrative reasons). It's focus is to support capacity building among developing island States in respect to fisheries statistics, regulation and enforcement. Proposals for the JTF are mostly coordinated by SPC/FFA to secure needs for all potential beneficiaries in an effective way. However, proposals from eligible individual CCMs are also welcome although any overlapping of the similar projects with the SPC/FFA are subject to coordination by the Steering Committee of the JTF.

Project History

Project titles and budget funded to the project are listed in tables below. Approved projects are required to submit a brief narrative and full financial report to the Steering Committee. The Steering Committee undertakes an appraisal and selects projects to be supported based on consistency of the proposals with the objectives of the JTF.
