There was no provision of data for years 2007 to 2010 owing to the absence of tuna fishing in the EEZ by locally flagged vessels over 10 m long and outside territorial waters.						

1. BACKGROUND AND HISTORY

Wallis and Futuna Islands are located south equator between 10°S and 15°S, at the eastern edge of warm pool.

The EEZ is 250 000 km² large, one of the three smallest in the region, and is surrounded by Fiji, Tonga, Samoa, Tuvalu and Tokelau.

Throughout the 80's and 90's, several licensing agreements were signed with Japanese and Korean fishing associations as part of general agreements with Pacific French Territories. The number of licenses opened under these agreements fell down from 50 to 2 over years, but no license has ever been effectively requested.

Up until late 2010, there hasn't been any domestic fleet fishing for tuna fleet, with the exception of a few short attempts.

2. RECENT ACTIVITY

There hasn't been any tuna fishing activity by the domestic fleet, made up of one single longliner, during 2012 and in 2013 as of today.

A few artisanal fishermen, less than 15, and as many game fishermen, fish nearshore for bottom species as main target and around FADs, using small crafts less tan 9m long. There's no monitoring conducted for their little activity.

LEGAL FRAME

As French Overseas Territory, Wallis and Futuna Islands have competency over territorial waters but EEZ keeps under French Government jurisdiction.

In the absence of licensing legislation for offshore fishing operations, the conditions for fishing in the EEZ, particularly obligations respective to data submission, are being set by an particular agreements between the company and the French Government representative.

3. DATA COLLECTION

In regards to data collection, last data reported to the Commission was only relying on logsheets submitted by the single longliner. Satellite monitoring wasn't arranged at that time and is still to be put in place. In that respect, the French National Center for Fisheries Monitoring ("CNSP") will probably be collecting the VMS data and forward it to The Fisheries Dpt when offshore activity starts. As for broader and more comprehensive data collection program, assistance from the Commission's Secretariat and SPC will be needed to set it up and cooperation arrangements with neighbour countries may be required to achieve a good observer coverage.

4. ANNUAL CATCH AND EFFORT DATA

As mentioned above, there has been no tuna fishing activity in 2012 apart from artisanal fishing nearshore.
