FFA DELEGATION PAPER TO WCPFC12 ON SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS OF SMALL ISLAND DEVELOPING STATES

At WCPFC11, FFA members submitted a paper (DP20_rev.2) to assist developed CCMs to implement Article 30 of the Convention and CMM 2013-07 by targeting their assistance to specific SIDS needs in tuna fisheries. This delegation paper articulated specific requirements of SIDS, and is to be updated by FFA members as required.

WCPFC11 agreed to use the checklist as a guide to assist developed CCMs to assist the status of assistance to SIDS.
