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OVERVIEW OF COMPLIANCE MONITORING SCHEME MATTERS FOR TCC12

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Paper prepared by the Secretariat

Purpose

- 1. The paper provides an overview of the draft Compliance Monitoring Report (dCMR) online systems and also presents for TCC12's consideration some observations from the Secretariat on this year's dCMR. There are three other related papers that cover other specific aspects of the dCMR namely:
 - a. Obligations to be assessed by the Compliance Monitoring Scheme (WCPFC-TCC12-2016-10B);
 - b. List of Capacity Assistance Needs Identified in dCMRs (WCPFC-TCC12-2016-10C); and
 - c. Summary of Investigation Status for alleged violations that may be relevant to dCMRs (WCPFC-TCC12-2016-10D).

Background

2. The Commission has been implementing the WCPFC Compliance Monitoring Scheme (CMS) since 2011. Its purpose is described in paragraph 1 of CMM 2015-07, as:

"to ensure that Members, Cooperating Non-Members and Participating Territories (CCMs) implement and comply with obligations arising under the Convention and conservation and management measures (CMMs) adopted by the Commission. The CMS is designed to:

(i) assess CCMs' compliance with their obligations;

(*ii*) *identify areas in which technical assistance or capacity building may be needed to assist CCMs to attain compliance;*

(*iii*) *identify aspects of conservation and management measures which may require refinement or amendment for effective implementation;*

(iv) respond to non-compliance through remedial options that include a range of possible responses that take account of the reason for and degree

of non-compliance, and include cooperative capacity-building initiatives and, in case of serious non-compliance, such penalties and other actions as may be necessary and appropriate to promote compliance with CMMs and other Commission obligations;¹ and

(v) monitor and resolve outstanding instances of non-compliance. Footnote 1: In accordance with the process for identifying responses to non-compliance adopted by the Commission to complement the Scheme, as provided for in paragraph 38 of this measure.

WCPFC Online Reporting Systems used to support the Compliance Monitoring Scheme

- 3. Since 2013, the WCPFC CMS continues to be supported by the online reporting systems for the Annual Report Part 2 and Compliance Monitoring which is hosted on the WCPFC Intranet using a Microsoft Sharepoint web application platform. In 2016, the Secretariat has continued the practice of using the individual CCM portal page on the secure side of the WCPFC website (each CCM has access to their own CCM portal, and not that of others) to facilitate the dissemination of additional supporting information relevant to draft CMRs other than alleged infringements detected through the observer reports.
- 4. For 2016, the WCPFC online reporting systems used to support the Compliance Monitoring Scheme was comprised of six (6) lists. Five have been used in previous years by the Secretariat and CCMs and they are:
 - a. Annual Reports Part 2 (RY 2015) ALL CCMs that are required to submit an Annual Report Part 2 to the Commission (170 questions);
 - b. Addressing CMR Issues This list is part of the 2016 Annual Report Part 2 and was relevant to only those CCMs who had a score of "Non-Compliant" or "Priority Non-Compliant" in the Final CMR Report adopted by WCPFC12. CMM 2015-07 paragraph 36 says: "Each CCM shall include, in its Part 2 Annual Report, any actions it has taken to address non-compliance identified in the Compliance Monitoring Report from previous years.
 - c. MTU Audit Inspections This list is relevant to CMM 2014-02 9a VMS SSPs 7.2.2 and CMM 2014-02 9a VMS SSPs 7.2.4 (Annual Report (RY 2015) Q-139 and/or Q-140). ALL CCMs that have answered "YES" to one or both of these questions in Annual Report Part 2 should have completed this section. This list can be accessed by CCMs throughout the year, and is not time-limited;
 - d. 01-July-2016 Reporting Deadline Checklist designed as a tool to allow CCMs to confirm to the Secretariat that they have completed one or more of the relevant annual reporting online lists for Annual Report Part 2. It also reminded CCMs about CMM 2013-10 paragraph 9 reporting requirement (Fished/Did Not Fish report) which is also due on 1 July 2016, and which is an important report for draft CMR reviews; and
 - e. The Compliance Monitoring Report (2015) was based on the WCPFC11 agreed template (Annex 1) and CMM 2015-07. CCM reported information in Annual Report Part 2 (YES/NO/not applicable and any explanations) and replies to the preliminary draft CMR, and these are auto-populated into the draft CMR report. The Compliance Monitoring Report template (2015) provided a mechanism for CCMs to submit as part of draft CMR replies their Investigation Status Reports, as stipulated under CMM 2015-07 paragraph 8 and Capacity Development Plans as stipulated under CMM

2015-07 paragraph 5. Annex II – V provide notes and list of CMM paragraphs that were included in the 2016 dCMR and Annual Report Part 2 online systems covering 2015 activities.

- 5. The sixth list is the new online system that was launched in 2016, was a new Compliance Case File online system to tracks individual alleged violations which may be relevant to the Compliance Monitoring Scheme. This online system supports the notification of alleged violations and can track progress for individual alleged violations, up until the conclusion of the investigation by the relevant flag CCM. For observer-data based alleged violations, flag CCMs are provided with details sufficient to commence their investigations eg to identify the vessel, the trip start and end dates, if relevant the fishing area, the CMM paragraph related to the alleged violation and observer programme that supplied the observer. Four lists have been published in the online Compliance Case File system to date and are currently accessible by the relevant flag CCM and the Secretariat:
 - a. Article 25-2 Compliance Cases: Contain any alleged infringements (other than ROP observer reported incidents listed below) in which a flag State investigation has been requested, in accordance with Article 25(2) of the Convention. For 2015, these request for flag State investigation were identified in aerial surveillance, HSBI, port inspection, VMS, Secretariat or other reports;
 - b. **FAD Sets Alleged infringements:** Contain alleged infringements, related to setting on FADs during the FAD closure period, identified in ROP observer data;
 - c. **Observer Obstruction Alleged Infringements:** Contain alleged infringements, related to observer obstruction, identified in ROP observer data; and
 - d. **Shark Catch Alleged Infringements:** Contain alleged infringements, related to shark finning or prohibition to retain silky shark or oceanic white-tip sharks identified in ROP observer data.
- 6. The successful delivery of the WCPFC online systems continues to be as a result of the combined efforts of the WCPFC Secretariat Compliance and IT staff, IMS contractor Taz-E P/L and website contractor Eighty Options. SPC provided assistance to the Secretariat so that the current ROP-data could be accessed and used as a source of information in the online Compliance Case File system.

2016 CCM Annual Reports and draft CMR submissions

- 7. Key dates for Annual Report Part 2 and draft CMRs online systems in 2016 were:
 - a. **5 February:** Fish/did not fish template sent out to CCMs (5 months in advance of the reporting deadline of 1 July);
 - b. **26 February:** 2016 Suggested Checklist for Reporting Requirements was published to website;
 - c. **29 February:** Annual Report Part 2 online system was made available for CCMs use (4 months in advance of the reporting deadline of 1 July) and Notification to CCMs was via *WCPFC Circular 2016/07* which included a 10-page quick guide and confirmed that the Secretariat will post copies of supporting files for draft CMRs on CCMs portals;

- d. **20 April:** Launch of Online Compliance Case File System Facility for tracking alleged infringements relevant to the Compliance Monitoring Scheme. Notification to CCMs was via *WCPFC Circular 2016/14*;
- e. **1 July:** Deadline for Annual Report Part 2;
- f. **4 July:** Deadline for Annual Report Part 1;
- g. **29 July:** Draft CMRs for thirty-seven (37) CCMs and one collective group of Members were made available for individual CCM review. The online system for CMR was updated by the Secretariat based on the WCPFC12 agreed list of obligations and the requirements of CMM 2015-07. Notification to CCMs was via *WCPFC Circular 2016/42* which included a 10-page quick guide for the draft CMR online system and advised of expansion of the Online Compliance Case File System to include Article 25(2) and Shark catch alleged infringements;
- h. **24 August:** was the cut-off date for CCM replies to their draft CMR for responses to be considered in the full draft CMR; and
- i. **8 September:** The full draft CMR was made available for all CCMs review. Notification to CCMs was via *WCPFC Circular 2016/47* and this circular also confirmed the process for CCMs to submit any additional information as replies to the full draft CMR in advance of TCC12.
- 8. Table 1 below provides as a comparison, the key statistics related to each year's draft CMR report: Annex 4 to this paper provides the list of the CMM paragraphs and Convention provisions which were included in the full draft CMR grouped by section.

Secretariat Observations

9. For the operations of the CMS last year (2015) and the first half of this year (2016) the Secretariat makes the following observations:

- a. At WCPFC12 the Commission pre-approved the list of obligations to be assessed under CMR for the next three years (WCPFC12 Summary Report Attachment O). The new Capacity Development Plan and Investigation Status Report features of the CMM 2015-07 were accommodated through modification of the template for online Compliance Monitoring Reporting (WCPFC11 Summary Report, Attachment W). In 2016, the timeliness of annual report submissions from CCMs has improved and details on CCM submissions of Annual Reports from 2010-2016 are provided in WCPFC-TCC12-2016-IP01. Together these initiatives assisted the Secretariat with completing the draft CMR as per CMM 2015-07;
- b. Despite the timely completion of the draft CMR, the WCPFC Secretariat MCS/compliance staff still has to carefully manage their work program and time and other commitments during the period of late April through the end of September, to meet the specified draft CMR deadlines and TCC annual meeting deadlines. In this respect the Secretariat would continue to insist that due consideration is given to the options raised at SC11/TCC11/WCPFC12 for agreement to an earlier submission date for Annual Report Part 1 and Part 2;
- c. The content and depth of analysis undertaken by the Secretariat in preparation of draft CMRs continues to improve and is supported by previous years and ongoing investments by the Commission on the development and enhancement of the WCPFC IMS hosted databases for CMM reporting at the Secretariat. In this respect the Commission will be asked to continue to support a budget for IMS developments and enhancements over the next two to three years (2016 2018); and
- d. CMM 2015-07 paragraph 40 says that the measure shall be reviewed in 2017 and the terms of that reviewed will be determined by TCC12 there is a separate paper on this issue (see WCPFC-TCC12-2016-11).

CMR Section: The sections are intended to reflect the relevant bullet points listed in paragraph 3 and also paragraph 4 of CMM 2015-07, and they are:

(i) Catch and effort limits for target species;

- (ii) Catch and effort reporting for target species;
- (iii) Reporting including with respect to implementation of measures for non-target species;
- (iv) Spatial and temporal closures and restrictions on the use of fish aggregating devices (FADs);
- (v) Authorisation to fish and RFV, observer, VMS coverage and HSBI scheme;
- (vi) Provision of scientific data; and

(vii) Submission of AR Part 2 and compliance with other reporting deadlines, including compliance with CMM 2015-07 para 36. Collective obligations as per para 4 of CMM 2015-07

CMM paragraph -

refers to the specific paragraph within a Conservation and Management Measure (CMM), or the Article and subparagraph of the Convention. The list of obligations is based on the list of obligations adopted at WCPFC 12 (WCPFC 11 para 469, Attachment O)

CCM Assessment – this was populated automatically from the same paragraph which was in AR Pt 2 covering 2015 activities – choice of YES (fully implemented), NO (not fully implemented) or N/A]. Note that this will be "blank" where a CCM had not completed this field in AR Pt 2, prior to the full dCMR being completed.

Applicability checked – populated by Secretariat.

In some cases, this might differ from a CCMs assessment in AR Pt 2, and was made based on the Secretariats understanding of the nature of the requirement and the characteristics of a particular CCMs fishery, eg whether a requirement applies to flag CCMs, or coastal CCMs.

CCM Implementation - populated automatically from ARPT2.

Any text explanations that CCMs have provided in AR Part 2 for their YES, NO or N/A answer in AR Pt 2 for the same CMM or Convention reporting requirement.

Potential Issue - populated by Secretariat

choice of: no issues detected; need additional information; potential compliance issue.

Secretariat Explanation - populated by Secretariat

- text explanation for the choice made by the Secretariat of potential issue. As applicable, there may be notes on supplementary information, including as applicable:

- quotes or notes from AR Pt1 reported information,
- notes on relevant information from WCPFC records and information from WCPFC databases,
- notes on updated information and advice from SPC, and
- a short reference (CMR issue (RY 2012 and/or RY 2013 and/or RY2014)) to highlight that the CCM had a previous year CMR issue for this CMM requirement or for a similar provision under a CMM which was replaced in 2014.

Summary of Issue - populated by Secretariat

- this column is closely related to the Secretariat explanation, and is a short title that seeks to summarize the Secretariat Explanation where "need additional information" or "potential compliance issue" has been chosen (this field is left blank where the potential issue choice was "no issues detected").

CCM Additional information – populated from any replies that WCPFC received as a reply to the draft dCMR report– these include those provided in the online dCMR system to a potential issue and any received by email or through the CCM portal. In some instances the Secretariat has included as notes some replies to CCMs comments and/or notes on additional information received. A cell will be blank either because the Secretariat had chosen "no issues detected" in the draft dCMR report sent to each CCM, or because the CCM chose not to provide a reply to the dCMR before August 28 (paragraph 12 of CMM 2015-07).

Capacity building requested - populated by the Secretariat, includes "YES" when CCM has noted in information that they require assistance. May include requests to subregional agencies

TCC Assessment/Potential Issue-TCC – to be populated by TCC/CMS working group

As a suggestion there could be a choice of: "no issues detected"; "potential compliance issue" and "not assessed".

TCC Explanation – to be populated by TCC/CMS working group

Text field which as a suggestion might be used by TCC for including

- Notes on corrective actions that the CCM is to undertake or capacity building that a CCM needs; and/or
- Notes on TCC's assessment based on the compliance status and next steps table, in Annex I to CMM 2015-07.
