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FFA Comments on the Proposed Observer Safety Measure

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## FFA COMMENTS ON THE PROPOSED OBSERVER SAFETY MEASURE

| 1. Commission Members, Cooperating Non-<br>Members and Participating Territories  | <b>Objective</b> – what is this CMM seeking to   |
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| <ul> <li>(CCMs) shall ensure that vessels flying their flag, when operating in the WCPF Convention Area, abide by all international requirements, procedures and protocols in the event that an observer dies, is missing or presumed fallen overboard while embarked on their vessel. In addition, CCMs shall ensure that in such an event, vessels flying their flag shall:</li> <li>a. notify the appropriate Maritime Rescue Coordination Centre, the flag state, the observer provider and the Secretariat of the incident as soon as possible;</li> <li>b. cooperate fully in any search and rescue operation; and</li> <li>c. cooperate fully in any and all official investigations.</li> </ul> | achieve – to set out clear responsibilities and<br>steps for what is to happen during emergency<br>situations? To promote cooperation amongst<br>all parties concerned? It would be useful to set<br>this out clearly.<br>Scope of application – What is the scope of<br>application of this CMM? Is it only intended to<br>deal with flag State responsibilities as set out in<br>para.230 of WCPFC12 Summary Record?<br>However, NOTE paras 5 and 7 which place<br>responsibilities on the observer providers.<br>The CMM needs to state clearly that this does<br>not take away the right of a coastal State to<br>prosecute for violations that occurred within its<br>waters.<br>Consideration to be given to the CMM including<br>a role for the port State for eg. to encourage<br>port States, where a vessel has been directed to<br>its port in any of the situations covered in this<br>measure, to cooperate by facilitating the entry<br>of the vessel, and to the extent possible,<br>assisting in the investigation.<br><b>Area of application</b> – the reference to<br>"Convention Area" is not consistent with the<br>scope of the ROP. Proposal to replace<br>references throughout the text to "when<br>operating in the WCPF Convention Area" with<br>"when operating under the Commission<br>Regional Observer Programme".<br>"abide by all international requirements,<br>procedures and protocols" – this is a vague<br>reference, and it would be useful to get clarity<br>from the US on what is being referred to here; |
