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ANNUAL REPORT ON THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE WCPFC DATA ACCESS RULES AND PROCEDURES

WCPFC-TCC13-2017-RP07 6 September 2017¹

Paper prepared by the Secretariat

Purpose

- 1. The purpose of this paper is:
 - i. to provide an updated summary of WCPFC non-scientific data holdings. This was initially requested by TCC11 and was presented to TCC12; and
 - ii. to provide a report for the year 2016 and 2017, on the administration of the two sets of rules currently in place, namely the:
 - Rules and Procedures for the Protection, Access to, and Dissemination of Data Compiled by the Commission (2007 data RaP); and
 - Rules and Procedures for the Protection, Access to, and Dissemination of High Seas Non-Public Domain Data and Information Compiled by the Commission for the Purpose of Monitoring, Control or Surveillance (MCS) Activities and the Access to and Dissemination of High Seas VMS Data for Scientific Purposes. (2009 MCS data RaP)

List of WCPFC non-scientific data holdings

2. TCC11 requested that the Secretariat summarizes the non-scientific data holdings of WCPFC for TCC12 (TCC11 Summary Report paragraph 376). **Annex 1** provides an updated list of WCPFC data holdings.

Access to WCPFC non-public domain data

3. As reported to previous TCC meetings, the Secretariat maintains its system of controls over approvals for access to WCPFC data and information. WCPFC non-public domain data can be disseminated only in accordance with the 2007 data RaP and 2009 MCS data RaP, and following the approval of the Executive Director. Copies of the approved "WCPFC data consideration request forms", original request and implementation instructions are kept on the WCPFC Information Management System. These protocols, in the past and currently, seem to have worked well with no known breaches occurring.

WCPFC data access 2016/2017

- 4. A register is required to be maintained by the Secretariat in accordance with paragraph 18 of the 2007 data RaP to record access to all WCPFC non-public domain data. The updated list for TCC13 is provided at **Annex 2** of this paper and relates to the period 2016/2017.²
- 5. **Annex 3** lists all the WCPFC client CCM logins which have been established within the WCPFC VMS system, for accessing WCPFC VMS data through SmartTrac software up until 30 June 2016 and for the new Trackwell system from 1 July 2016 onward.
- 6. In 2016/2017, the Secretariat received and processed sixty (60) requests from Members and others for specific WCPFC data, some of which related to multiple types of WCPFC non-public domain data. **Annex 4** provides a list of WCPFC data requests which were approved or actioned in 2016/17. It should be noted that despite some requests being standing requests for relevant WCPFC data, automated extraction and provision IT tools are yet to be developed for WCPFC data other than WCPFC VMS and ROP data.

Update to the Register of Authorized MCS Entities and Personnel

- 7. 2009 MCS Data Rules and Procedures (2009 RaP) paragraph 12 require the Secretariat to maintain a register of Authorized MCS Entities and Personnel. This list is available to authorized CCM users on the secure page of the website at https://www.wcpfc.int/official-circulars-and-contacts Since August 2015, one of these groups of official contact details that has been maintained is the Authorized MCS Entities and Personnel for each CCMs.
- 8. CCMs are again asked to check and ensure that these are accurate and up-to-date.

CCMs reporting on implementation of MCS data RaP, paragraph 44, covering 2016 activities

- 9. As with previous years, a question was included in the Annual Report Part 2 covering 2016 activities regarding CCMs implementation of paragraph 44 of MCS Data RaP. CCMs had the choice of answering "Yes" meaning the obligation has been implemented; "No" meaning the obligation has not been implemented; or "N/A" meaning CCM determined that the obligation is not applicable. CCMs also had the opportunity to provide further information on each obligation and/or attach any supporting documentations.
- 10. Twelve CCMs answered "N/A" with regards to MCS RaP paragraph 44; 21 CCMs answered "Yes" and provided some further information; 1 CCM answered "NO" and explained that it is a CNM and 3 CCM have not submitted an Annual Report Part 2. Of the 21 CCMs that answered "Yes", some provided further information to say that, in summary: data requested is not disseminated and is destroyed in accordance with the rules; CCMs complied with the data retention and destruction requirements; confidentiality of the data received is ensured under regulation; and that processes and procedures are in place to maintain the confidentiality and security of the data.

Recommendation

10. TCC13 is invited to consider and note the report on the administration of the WCPFC data access rules and procedures.

Annex 2: Register of Access to WCPFC data by persons duly authorised by the Executive Director, within the WCPFC Secretariat and Service Providers, as well as Officers of the Commission (as at 26 August 2017)

The following register is being maintained in accordance with paragraph 18 of the 2007 Rules and Procedures for the Protection, Access to, and Dissemination of Data Compiled by the Commission, which states...

4.3 Access to Non-Public Domain data by the Staff of the Secretariat, the WCPFC Service Providers and Officers of the Commission and its Subsidiary Bodies

18. Persons duly authorised by the Executive Director, within the WCPFC secretariat and service providers, including scientific experts engaged under Article 13 of the Convention, shall have access to the data necessary to perform their WCPFC duties. Officers of the Commission and its subsidiary bodies shall have access to the data necessary to perform their WCPFC duties. All such persons shall sign a Confidentiality Agreement with the Executive Director and maintain the data security standards of the Commission in respect of data to which they have access. The Executive Director shall maintain a Register of all such persons (including the purpose for which they require access to the data) and make the Register available to a CCM on written request.

There are general categories of access to WCPFC data by WCPFC staff and service providers. In accordance with paragraph 18 of 2007 data RaP, all Secretariat staff, including short term individuals working with the Secretariat, eg interns and temporary data entry staff have been required to sign a confidentiality agreement as a condition of their working with the Commission. Service providers have a confidentiality agreement as part of their contract with WCPFC.

A summary of access to WCPFC non-public domain data and information is provided here:

Secure CCM section on the WCPFC website

The Commission has a secure web page that is accessible to Members for sensitive documents, non-public information for meetings or compliance information, such as Register of MCS entities and personnel Register, CNM applications and analyses, draft and Provisional IUU lists. Draft and Provisional Compliance Monitoring Reports, CCMs Annual Report Part 2 and High Seas Pocket Monitoring. In 2014, the Individual CCM portal pages were created (each CCM can access only their own pages and not that of others), and CCMs are provided with supporting information for draft CMRs, as well as an ability to maintain their official contacts list. In 2016 & 2017, the CCM portal pages were again used to disseminate supporting information for Compliance Monitoring Reports.

Eastern High Seas Pocket Special Management Area WCPFC VMS data and manual entry and exit reports is in accordance with CMM 2010-02

Direct Data Entry for WCPFC RFV

Login to the WCPFC Record of Fishing Vessels system, for CCMs to create and modify their vessel records on the Record of Fishing Vessels. This capability is available to all CCMs after the RFV SSPs came into force in June 2014. FFA is also given access to the RFV as a duly authorized MCS entity on behalf of some of its members.

Compliance Monitoring Report and Annual Report Part 2

A login provided to each CCM to the WCPFC intranet for CCMs to complete their Annual Report Part 2 and enter their reply to their preliminary draft Compliance Monitoring Report. This login is used for MTU audit data entry by CCMs.

WCPFC VMS Trackwell system – from 1 July 2016 onwards

The VMS SmartTRAC system ended on 30 June 2016 and moved to a new VMS service, using Trackwell system from 1 July 2016. By the cut-over date of 1 July 2016, all CCMs had received their login accounts, together with the latest version of the VMS User Manual. All the individual logins are administered by the WCPFC VMS Manager, duly authorized as submitted by their official VMS contact. All authorized logins have the permissions to access the relevant areas in their EEZ, if CCM have 'flicked the switch', and any other areas as previously agreed. Backup support is provided by the WCPFC ICT Manager and escalated to the Trackwell service provider as required.
