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OVERVIEW OF COMPLIANCE MONITORING SCHEME MATTERS FOR TCC13

WCPFC-TCC13-2017-11a

8 September 2017

Paper prepared by the Secretariat

Purpose

1. The paper provides an overview of the WCPFC online reporting systems used to support the Compliance Monitoring Scheme and includes some observations from the Secretariat on this year's draft CMR. There are three accompanying papers that cover specific topics of:
 - a. List of Capacity Assistance Requests and Capacity Development Plan (WCPFC-TCC13-2017-11b);
 - b. Summary of Investigation Status for alleged violations notified in the WCPFC online compliance case file system (WCPFC-TCC13-2017-11c); and
 - c. Notes on obligations needing revision to improve compliance and monitoring or with interpretation issues (WCPFC-TCC13-2017-11d).
2. TCC13 is invited to consider this paper together with the three accompanying papers on Compliance Monitoring Scheme matters and as appropriate, make recommendations to WCPFC14.

Background

3. The Commission has been implementing the WCPFC Compliance Monitoring Scheme since 2011. Its current purpose is described in paragraph 1 of CMM 2015-07, as:

“to ensure that Members, Cooperating Non-Members and Participating Territories (CCMs) implement and comply with obligations arising under the Convention and conservation and management measures (CMMs) adopted by the Commission. The CMS is designed to:

 - (i) assess CCMs' compliance with their obligations;*
 - (ii) identify areas in which technical assistance or capacity building may be needed to assist CCMs to attain compliance;*
 - (iii) identify aspects of conservation and management measures which may require refinement or amendment for effective implementation;*

(iv) respond to non-compliance through remedial options that include a range of possible responses that take account of the reason for and degree of non-compliance, and include cooperative capacity-building initiatives and, in case of serious non-compliance, such penalties and other actions as may be necessary and appropriate to promote compliance with CMMs and other Commission obligations;¹ and

(v) monitor and resolve outstanding instances of non-compliance.

Footnote 1: In accordance with the process for identifying responses to non-compliance adopted by the Commission to complement the Scheme, as provided for in paragraph 38 of this measure.

4. CMM 2015-07 paragraph 41 says that the measure will be effective for 2016 and 2017 only. In addition and commencing in 2017, the Commission has tasked a three-person panel to conduct an Independent Review of the Compliance Monitoring Scheme, with a final report due by March 2018. TCC13 paper *WCPFC-TCC13-2017-10* provides an update on the progress and process for the Review to date.

2017 CCM Annual Reports and draft CMR submissions

5. Key dates for CCM annual reporting, draft CMRs and the associated WCPFC online systems in 2017 were:
 - i. **26 February:** *2016 Suggested Checklist for Reporting Requirements* was published to WCPFC website;
 - ii. **6 March:** Fish/did not fish template (CMM 2013-10 09) sent out to CCMs, which is four (4) months in advance of the reporting deadline of 1 July;
 - iii. **15 March:** Annual Report Part 2 online system was made available for CCMs use, which is four (4) months in advance of the reporting deadline of 1 July. (Notification to CCMs was via *WCPFC Circular 2017/19* and this included a 15-page quick guide to assist CCMs with completing Annual Report Part 2 and Managing Compliance Cases);
 - iv. **22 March:** The Secretariat issued templates for *WCPFC Investigation Status Report for draft CMR* and *WCPFC Capacity Development Plan for draft CMR*. (Notification to CCMs was via *WCPFC Circular 2017/28*);
 - v. **13 April:** CCMs were advised of additional 2015 and new 2016 alleged infringements based on ROP observer data that had been included in the online Compliance Case file system and work has commenced to upload supporting documentation for this years draft CMR on the secure side of the WCPFC website CCM portals (Notification to CCMs was via *WCPFC Circular 2017/28*);
 - vi. **1 May:** CCMs were advised of additional updates in the online Compliance Case file system, including new 2016 alleged infringements in two new lists titled *ROP pre-notification issues* and *cetacean and whale shark interactions* (Notification to CCMs was via *WCPFC Circular 2017/32*);
 - vii. **1 July:** Deadline for Annual Report Part 2 and Fish/did not fish template submissions (CMM 2013-10 09);
 - viii. **10 July:** Deadline for Annual Report Part 1 submissions;
 - ix. **3 August:** The Secretariat issued draft CMRs for thirty-seven (37) CCMs and one collective group of Members for individual CCM review. The online system for

CMR was updated by the Secretariat considering the WCPFC13 agreed list of obligations and the requirements of CMM 2015-07. (Notification to CCMs was via *WCPFC Circular 2017/56* - which included a 14-page quick guide to assist CCMs with completing draft CMR online and Managing Compliance Cases);

- x. **30 August:** cut-off date for CCM replies to their draft CMR, if the CCM would like their responses to be considered in the full draft CMR (refer to *CMM 2015-07 para 24*); and
 - xi. **12 September:** The full draft CMR is to be made available for all CCMs review, in advance of TCC13. The Secretariat will separately post any additional CCM replies received on the draft CMR prior to the start of TCC13 (refer to *CMM 2015-07 para 26*).
6. One of the key inputs to the Compliance Monitoring Scheme since its implementation has been the draft CMR which the Secretariat is tasked to prepare and issue around late July each year. In the early years of CMS implementation (2011 -2013), the scope of the draft CMR was as a compilation of "...information received through Part 1 and 2 Annual Reports, other reporting obligations, the transshipment program, the regional observer program, the Vessel Monitoring System and any other data collection programs of the Commission."
7. Since 2014, the scope of the draft CMR has been expanded to what is contained in paragraph 22 of CMM 2015-07:
- "22. Prior to the annual meeting of the TCC, the Executive Director shall prepare a Draft Compliance Monitoring Report (the Draft Report) that consists of individual draft Compliance Monitoring Reports (dCMRs) concerning each CCM and a section concerning collective obligations arising from the Convention or CMMs related to fishing activities managed under the Convention. Each dCMR shall reflect information relating to the relevant CCM's implementation of obligations as reflected in paragraph 3 or modified by paragraph 15, as well as any potential compliance issues, where appropriate. Such information shall be sourced from reports submitted by CCMs as required in CMMs and other Commission obligations, such as Parts 1 and 2 of the Annual Reports as well as information available to the Commission through other data collection programs, including but not limited to, high seas transshipment reports, regional observer program data and information, Vessel Monitoring System information, High Seas Boarding and Inspection Scheme reports, and charter notifications; and where appropriate, any additional suitably documented information regarding compliance during the previous calendar year. The Draft Report shall present all available information relating to each CCM's implementation of obligations for compliance review by TCC."
8. In response to the scope of the draft CMR, the breadth and depth of analysis undertaken by the Secretariat in preparation of draft CMRs has been expected to incrementally expand over the years of implementing the Compliance Monitoring Scheme. The Secretariats response to the draft CMR task, has included careful work planning and efforts to build and enhance WCPFC IMS hosted databases for centralizing records of CMM reporting and development of integrated MCS analytical tools at the Secretariat.

9. Table 1 below provides as a comparison, the key statistics related to each year's draft CMR report. Annex IIIA and Annex IIIB to this paper provides the list of the CMM paragraphs and Convention provisions which were included in the full draft CMR grouped by section and by CMM.

WCPFC Online Reporting Systems used to support the Compliance Monitoring Scheme

10. As has been the case since 2013, the WCPFC Compliance Monitoring Scheme continues to be supported by the WCPFC online reporting systems.
11. In 2017, the WCPFC online reporting systems used to support the Compliance Monitoring Scheme was comprised of six (6) lists that are hosted on the WCPFC Intranet using a Microsoft Sharepoint web application platform:
 - i. **Annual Reports Part 2 (RY 2016):** ALL CCMs that are required to submit an Annual Report Part 2 to the Commission (174 questions);
 - ii. **Addressing CMR-2015 Issues:** This list is part of the 2016 Annual Report Part 2 and was relevant to only those CCMs who had a score of “Non-Compliant”, “Priority Non-Compliant”, “Capacity Assistance Needed” or “Flag State Investigation” in the Final CMR Report adopted by WCPFC13. CMM 2015-07 paragraph 36 says: “*Each CCM shall include, in its Part 2 Annual Report, any actions it has taken to address non-compliance identified in the Compliance Monitoring Report from previous years.*”
 - iii. **MTU Audit Inspections:** This list is relevant to CMM 2014-02 9a VMS SSPs 7.2.2 and CMM 2014-02 9a VMS SSPs 7.2.4 (Annual Report (RY 2016) Q-105 and/or Q-106). ALL CCMs that have answered “YES” to one or both of these questions in Annual Report Part 2 should have completed this section. This list can be accessed by CCMs throughout the year, and is not time-limited;
 - iv. **01-July-2017 Reporting Deadline Checklist:** designed as a tool to allow CCMs to confirm to the Secretariat that they have completed one or more of the relevant annual reporting online lists for Annual Report Part 2. It also reminded CCMs about CMM 2013-10 paragraph 9 reporting requirement (Fished/Did Not Fish report) which is also due on 1 July 2017, and which is an important report for draft CMR reviews; and
 - v. **WCPFC Online Compliance Case File system:** to track individual alleged violations (for further details please refer to *WCPFC-TCC13-2017-11c*)
 - vi. **Compliance Monitoring Reports (2016):** the template was based on the WCPFC11 agreed template and CMM 2015-07 (Annex I provides the template for 2016 draft Compliance Monitoring Report). CCM reported information that is completed in the online reporting system for Annual Report Part 2 (YES/NO/not applicable and any explanations) and online reporting system for submitting replies to the draft CMR, assists the Secretariat with accurately transferring the CCM reported information into the full Compliance Monitoring Report (2016). The Compliance Monitoring Report template (2016) also collates information CCMs have submitted as part of draft CMR replies of Investigation Status Reports, as stipulated under CMM 2015-07 paragraph 8 and of Capacity Development Plans as stipulated under CMM 2015-07 paragraph 5.
12. Annex I to this paper provides the template for 2016 draft Compliance Monitoring Report. Annexes II – IV to this paper provide notes and list of CMM paragraphs that were included in the 2017 draft CMR and Annual Report Part 2 online systems covering 2016 activities.
13. In 2017, the Secretariat has also continued the practice of using the individual CCM portal page on the secure side of the WCPFC website (each CCM has access to their own CCM portal, and not that of others) to facilitate the dissemination of additional supporting

information relevant to draft CMRs. As in past years, the Secretariat commenced posting supporting information relevant to draft CMR in April 2017 (WCPFC Circular 2017/28).

14. The successful delivery of the WCPFC online systems continue to be a result of the combined efforts of the WCPFC Secretariat Compliance and IT staff, IMS contractor Taz-E P/L and website contractor Eighty Options. In 2016/17 the Secretariat also acknowledges the contribution of SPC-OFP colleagues, who provided considerable assistance to the Secretariat so that ROP-data could be used as a source in the online Compliance Case File system.

Secretariat Observations

15. The Secretariat makes the following observations related to the Compliance Monitoring Scheme:
 - a. In 2017, the content and depth of analysis undertaken by the Secretariat in preparation of draft CMRs continued to expand and is supported by previous years and ongoing investments by the Commission on the development and enhancement of the WCPFC IMS hosted databases for CMM reporting at the Secretariat and the development of the WCPFC online reporting systems;
 - b. In response to the tasks in CMM 2015-07, the Secretariat MCS/compliance staff carefully structure and manage their work program and timelines during the period of late April through the end of September, to meet the specified draft CMR deadlines and TCC annual meeting commitments and deadlines;
 - c. The Commission agreeing to a list of obligations to be assessed under CMR (WCPFC13 Summary Report Attachment I) did assist the Secretariat with: (i) early issuance of the online Annual Report Part 2 system for CCMs to use in 2016 and 2017; (ii) providing notes to remind CCMs of the obligations that will be reviewed in the draft CMR in a particular year; (iii), its own internal preparations of the online systems for Compliance Monitoring Report development; and (iv) forward planning the investigation of analytical approaches and scheduling the development of IT tools needed to support draft CMR preparations;
 - d. The additional efforts that many CCMs have made to make earlier annual report submissions has been appreciated by the Secretariat and in 2017 did assist the Secretariat with meeting the draft CMR issuance deadline in CMM 2015-07 (see *WCPFC-TCC13-2017-IP01*); and
 - e. Looking towards 2018, there is presently some uncertainty as to what the Compliance Monitoring Scheme-related tasks to the Secretariat will be in 2018, because CMM 2015-07 paragraph 41 says that the measure will be effective for 2016 and 2017 only.

CMR Section: The sections are intended to reflect the relevant bullet points listed in paragraph 3 and also paragraph 4 of CMM 2015-07, and they are:

- (i) Catch and effort limits for target species;
 - (ii) Catch and effort reporting for target species;
 - (iii) Reporting including with respect to implementation of measures for non-target species;
 - (iv) Spatial and temporal closures and restrictions on the use of fish aggregating devices (FADs);
 - (v) Authorisation to fish and RFV, observer, VMS coverage and HSBI scheme;
 - (vi) Provision of scientific data; and
 - (vii) Submission of AR Part 2 and compliance with other reporting deadlines, including compliance with CMM 2015-07 para 36.
- Collective obligations as per para 4 of CMM 2015-07

CMM paragraph -

refers to the specific paragraph within a Conservation and Management Measure (CMM), or the Article and subparagraph of the Convention. The list of obligations is based on the list of obligations adopted at WCPFC 13 (WCPFC 13 para 158, Attachment I)

CCM Assessment – this was populated automatically from the same paragraph which was in AR Pt 2 covering 2016 activities – choice of YES (fully implemented), NO (not fully implemented) or N/A]. Note that this will be "blank" where a CCM had not completed this field in AR Pt 2, prior to the full draft CMR being completed.

Applicability checked – populated by Secretariat.

In some cases, this might differ from a CCMs assessment in AR Pt 2, and was made based on the Secretariats understanding of the nature of the requirement and the characteristics of a particular CCMs fishery, eg whether a requirement applies to flag CCMs, or coastal CCMs.

CCM Implementation - populated automatically from ARPT2.

Any text explanations that CCMs have provided in AR Part 2 for their YES, NO or N/A answer in AR Pt 2 for the same CMM or Convention reporting requirement.

Potential Issue - populated by Secretariat

choice of: no issues detected; need additional information; potential compliance issue.

Secretariat Explanation - populated by Secretariat

– text explanation for the choice made by the Secretariat of potential issue. As applicable, there may be notes on supplementary information, including as applicable:

- quotes or notes from AR Pt1 reported information,
- notes on relevant information from WCPFC records and information from WCPFC databases,
- notes on updated information and advice from SPC, and
- a short reference (CMR issue (RY 2012 and/or RY 2013 and/or RY2014)) to highlight that the CCM had a previous year CMR issue for this CMM requirement or for a similar provision under a CMM which was replaced in 2014.

Summary of Issue - populated by Secretariat

– this column is closely related to the Secretariat explanation, and is a short title that seeks to summarize the Secretariat Explanation where “need additional information” or “potential compliance issue” has been chosen (this field is left blank where the potential issue choice was “no issues detected”).

CCM Additional information – populated from any replies that WCPFC received as a reply to the draft CMR report– these include those provided in the online draft CMR system to a potential issue and any received by email or through the CCM portal. In some instances the Secretariat has included as notes some replies to CCMs comments and/or notes on additional information received. A cell will be blank either because the Secretariat had chosen “no issues detected” in the draft CMR report sent to each CCM, or because the CCM chose not to provide a reply to the draft CMR before August 28 (paragraph 12 of CMM 2015-07).

Capacity building requested - populated by the Secretariat, includes "YES" when CCM has noted in information that they require assistance. May include requests to subregional agencies

TCC Assessment/Potential Issue-TCC – to be populated by TCC/CMS working group

As a suggestion there could be a choice of: "no issues detected"; "potential compliance issue" and "not assessed".

TCC Explanation – to be populated by TCC/CMS working group

Text field which as a suggestion might be used by TCC for including

- Notes on corrective actions that the CCM is to undertake or capacity building that a CCM needs; and/or
- Notes on TCC’s assessment based on the compliance status and next steps table, in Annex I to CMM 2015-07.
