BYCATCH DATA IMPROVEMENT

- SC14 TASK: REVIEW SEA TURTLE WORKSHOP RECS
- Better sea turtle species IDs
- Recording bait type at a finer scale than set
- Recording which hooks were observed
- Recording line weighting at the set level
- Recording of dusk-dawn setting (reconcile PS and LL requirements)

SAFE RELEASE

SC14 TASK: DEVELOP GUIDELINES (SHARKS & RAYS)

 Suggestions for shark and ray safe release can be found in EB-IP-03

- Interest in developing seabird safe release under CMM 2017-06
- Did not examine safe release guidelines for sea turtles (WCPFC already has these)

SEA TURTLE MITIGATION

- SC14 TASK: REVIEW MITIGATION OPTIONS
- Finfish bait less attractive to turtles and used by many fisheries already
- Circle hooks effective and widely used; no particular safety or cost issues; sometimes higher shark catch due to fewer bite-offs

SEABIRD MITIGATION

SC14 TASK: REVIEW HOOK SHIELDING DEVICES

- Hookpods reduce seabird bycatch; no crew safety issues but costs may be high
- Smart tuna hook reduces seabird bycatch; no effect on target species but concerns about metal release
