# LIST OF CAPACITY ASSISTANCE REQUESTS AND CAPACITY DEVELOPMENT PLANS

WCPFC-TCC14-2018-8B 13 September 2018

#### Paper prepared by the Secretariat

### **Purpose**

1. This paper summarizes Capacity Assistance needs identified by CCMs, based on this year's Annual Report Part 2 reporting and/or draft Compliance Monitoring Report (draft CMR) replies. The summary information provided also indicates where CCMs have provided submissions related to Capacity Development Plans (CMM 2017-07 paragraphs 5 – 7) as part of replies to this year's draft CMR. The information is as at 10<sup>th</sup> September 2018.

# **Background**

- 2. As in previous years, and in accordance with CMM 2017-07, CCMs may provide in their Annual Report Part 2 and in replies to draft CMRs, indications of areas where assistance is needed.
- 3. CMM 2017-07 paragraph 24 states:
  - 24. Upon receipt of its dCMR, each CCM may, where appropriate, reply to the Executive Director no later than 28 days prior to TCC each year to:
    - (i) provide additional information, clarifications, amendments or corrections to information contained in its dCMR;
    - (ii) identify any particular difficulties with respect to implementation of any obligations; or
    - (iii)identify technical assistance or capacity building needed to assist the CCM with implementation of any obligations.
- 4. CMM 2017-07 paragraph 5 also states:
  - 5. Notwithstanding paragraph 3, where a SIDS or Participating Territory, or Indonesia or the Philippines cannot meet a particular obligation that is being assessed, due to a lack of capacity<sup>2</sup>, that CCM shall provide a Capacity Development Plan to the Secretariat with their draft Compliance Monitoring Report (dCMR), that:
    - (i) clearly identifies and explains what is preventing that CCM from meeting that obligation;
    - (ii) identifies the capacity building assistance needed to allow that CCM to meet that obligation;

(iii) estimates the costs and/or technical resources associated with such assistance, including, if possible, funding and technical assistance sources where necessary; (iv) sets out an anticipated timeframe in which, if the identified assistance needs are provided, that CCM will be able to meet that obligation.

The CCM may work together with the Secretariat to draft the Capacity Development Plan. This plan shall be attached to that CCM's comments to the dCMR.

Footnote 2: Any CCM may identify a capacity assistance need through the CMS process; however, the application of paragraphs 5 - 7 is limited to those CCMs identified in the paragraph.

5. In respect of Capacity Development Plans, Circular No.:2018/44 dated 2<sup>nd</sup> August, 2018 announcing the availability online for each CCM of their draft CMR included a Quick Guide on how to submit Capacity Development Plan with CCM's draft CMR response. The Secretariat throughout August also reached out to CCMs drawing attention to this aspect of the draft CMR and offering assistance if needed.

# Obligations where assistance needs were identified

- 6. A summary of the CMM paragraphs and topics where CCMs have indicated a capacity assistance need is provided in **Table 1**. The list provided in Table 1 includes obligations (CMM paragraphs) where at least one CCM has included some sort of response within the part of the draft CMR template that was titled "Capacity Development Plan" or had indicated a capacity assistance need within their Annual Report Part 2 reporting. Summary details relevant to the WCPFC14 adopted Final Compliance Monitoring Report score of **Capacity Assistance Needed** are also included in **Table 1**. In addition, **Table 2** provides a list of obligations (CMM Paragraphs) where a CCM indicated in their 2018 Annual Report Part 2 covering 2017 activities, some sort of request for assistance related to obligations or topics that are outside the scope of the approved list of obligations for CMRs.
- 7. Authorised CCMs users may view individual CCMs indications of assistance needs by:
  - a. reviewing the full draft Compliance Monitoring Report on the Intranet and filtering by the appropriate column to show the CCMs and CMM paragraphs where CCMs had indicated they had an assistance need; or
  - b. reviewing the full draft CMR MS Excel export, which can be filtered, to show the CCMs and CMM paragraphs where CCMs had indicated they had an assistance need.
- 8. Copies of Capacity Development Plans submissions, requests for assistance in draft CMR, additional requests for assistance in Annual Report Part 2, and reports in response to Capacity Assistance Needed scores from WCPFC14 are viewable by authorized CCMs users through the secure side of the WCPFC website on 13 September 2018 as TCC14-2018-dCMR01-CDP, TCC14-2018-dCMR01, TCC14-2018-dCMR-assistance and WCPFC-TCC14-2018-AR Pt2 respectively.

#### Recommendation

9. TCC14 is invited to consider the capacity assistance needs listed in Table 1 and Table 2 and any other areas identified by CCMs during TCC14's review of draft CMRs when developing the Provisional Compliance Report and noting the task set out in paragraph 30 (ii) of CMM 2017-07.
