ANNUAL REPORT ON THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE WCPFC DATA ACCESS RULES AND PROCEDURES

> WCPFC-TCC16-2020-RP08 31 August 2020

Paper by the Secretariat

Purpose

- 1. The purpose of this paper is to provide:
 - i. an updated summary of WCPFC non-scientific data holdings; and
 - ii. a report for the period 1 January 2019 30 June 2020 on the administration of the two sets of rules currently in place:
 - Rules and Procedures for the Protection, Access to, and Dissemination of Data Compiled by the Commission (2007 data RaP); and
 - Rules and Procedures for the Protection, Access to, and Dissemination of High Seas Non-Public Domain Data and Information Compiled by the Commission for the Purpose of Monitoring, Control or Surveillance (MCS) Activities and the Access to and Dissemination of High Seas VMS Data for Scientific Purposes. (2009 MCS data RaP).

List of WCPFC non-scientific data holdings

2. TCC11 requested that the Secretariat summarize the non-scientific data holdings of WCPFC for TCC12.¹ Annex 1 provides an updated list for TCC of WCPFC data holdings.

Access to WCPFC non-public domain data

3. As reported to previous TCC meetings, the Secretariat maintains its system of controls over approvals for access to WCPFC data and information. WCPFC non-public domain data can be disseminated only in accordance with the 2007 data RaP and 2009 MCS data RaP and with the approval of the Executive Director. Copies of the approved "WCPFC data consideration request forms", original request and implementation instructions are kept on the WCPFC Information Management System. These protocols continue to work well.

4. On 19th February 2020, the Secretariat identified a technical issue with the compliance case file system. Thirteen recently created Article 25(2) compliance cases could, at the time, potentially have been viewed by all CCMs. This situation occurred during 25 January – 19 February 2020. The Secretariat took prompt action when it discovered this on 19th February. The issue was resolved on the same day to ensure these cases could only be viewed in the online compliance case file system by the Secretariat, the relevant flag State and notifying/inspecting Member. Following this, the Secretariat wrote to relevant CCMs to

advise them of this technical issue and assured CCMs that necessary steps have been taken to prevent this technical issue from reoccurring.

WCPFC data access 2019/2020

5. A register is required to be maintained by the Secretariat in accordance with paragraph 18 of the 2007 data RaP to record access to all WCPFC non-public domain data. The updated list for TCC16 is provided in **Annex 2** for the period $2019/2020.^2$

6. **Annex 3** provides a list of all the CCM logins to the WCPFC VMS system during the period covered by this report.

7. In 2019/2020, the Secretariat processed seventy-five (75) requests from Members and others for specific WCPFC data, some of which related to multiple types of WCPFC non-public domain data. **Annex 4** provides a list of WCPFC data requests which were approved or actioned in 2019/2020. It should be noted that despite some requests being standing requests for relevant WCPFC data, automated extraction and provision IT tools are yet to be developed for WCPFC data other than WCPFC VMS and ROP data.

8. Since March 2019, a list of non-public domain data requests received and actioned and a corresponding bar chat has been published at <u>https://www.wcpfc.int/administration-wcpfc-data-access-rules-and-procedures</u> and is exportable in CSV format. It should be noted that this list is based on the date that the request was received by the Secretariat (and does not consider the period of data covered by the request). Consequently, actioned standing requests for WCPFC VMS data that are listed in Annex 3 will not necessarily be represented in the display of non-public domain data requests eg 100nm high seas buffer around EEZ.

Update to the Register of Authorized MCS Entities and Personnel

9. 2009 MCS Data Rules and Procedures (2009 RaP) paragraph 12 requires the Secretariat to maintain a register of Authorized MCS Entities and Personnel. This list is available to authorized CCM users on the secure page of the website at https://www.wcpfc.int/official-circulars-and-contacts. Since August 2015, one of these groups of official contact details that has been maintained is the Authorized MCS Entities and Personnel for each CCMs. CCMs are again asked to check and ensure that these are accurate and up-to-date.

CCMs reporting on implementation of MCS data RaP, paragraph 44, covering 2019 activities

10. As with previous years, a question was included in the Annual Report Part 2 covering 2018 activities regarding CCMs implementation of paragraph 44 of MCS Data RaP. CCMs had the choice of answering "Yes" meaning the obligation has been implemented; "No" meaning the obligation has not been implemented; or "N/A" meaning CCM determined that the obligation is not applicable. CCMs also had the opportunity to provide further information on each obligation and/or attach any supporting documentations.

11. Thirteen CCMs answered "N/A" and 2 CCMs answered 'No' with regards to MCS RaP paragraph 44. Twenty CCMs answered "Yes" and provided further information on their request; how they manage storage and/or access to and destruction of the data, that processes and procedures are in place to maintain the confidentiality and security of the data or that they comply with the data retention and destruction requirements.

Recommendation

12. TCC16 is invited to consider and note the report on the administration of the WCPFC data access rules and procedures.

Background

The following register of access is being maintained in accordance with paragraph 18 of the 2007 Rules and Procedures for the Protection, Access to, and Dissemination of Data Compiled by the Commission, which states...

4.3 Access to Non-Public Domain data by the Staff of the Secretariat, the WCPFC Service Providers and Officers of the Commission and its Subsidiary Bodies

18. Persons duly authorised by the Executive Director, within the WCPFC secretariat and service providers, including scientific experts engaged under Article 13 of the Convention, shall have access to the data necessary to perform their WCPFC duties. Officers of the Commission and its subsidiary bodies shall have access to the data necessary to perform their WCPFC duties. All such persons shall sign a Confidentiality Agreement with the Executive Director and maintain the data security standards of the Commission in respect of data to which they have access. The Executive Director shall maintain a Register of all such persons (including the purpose for which they require access to the data) and make the Register available to a CCM on written request.

There are general categories of access to WCPFC data by WCPFC staff and service providers. In accordance with the 2007 data RaP paragraph 18, all Secretariat staff, including short term individuals working with the Secretariat, e.g. interns and temporary data entry staff, have been required to sign a confidentiality agreement as a condition of their working with the Commission. Service providers have a confidentiality agreement as part of their contract with WCPFC.

Summary of access to WCPFC non-public domain data and information

Secure CCM section on the WCPFC website

The Commission has a secure web page that is accessible to Members for sensitive documents, nonpublic information for meetings or compliance information, such as the Register of MCS entities and personnel, CNM applications and analyses, draft and Provisional IUU lists, Draft and Provisional Compliance Monitoring Reports, CCMs Annual Report Part 2 and High Seas Pocket Monitoring.

In 2014, the Individual CCM portal pages were created giving each CCM access to only their own pages and not that of others. CCMs are provided with supporting information for draft CMRs, as well as an ability to maintain their official contacts list. Since 2016, the CCM portal pages have been used to disseminate supporting information for Compliance Monitoring Reports. Since 2018, a VMS reporting list has been routinely published through each CCMs portal page showing each of their flagged vessels that are listed on the RFV. Since 2020, a High seas transhipment (TSER) report has been routinely published through each cCMs portal page access to their high seas transhipment notifications and high seas transhipment declarations as received by WCPFC, including those reports that have been submitted using the TSER APP.

- SPC-OFP staff working on behalf of the Commission;
- Consultants for matters related to their tasking with WCPFC;
- Each Member or Territory according to their request; and
- Certain representatives of WCPFC-registered inter-governmental sub-regional agencies which are recognized as providing advice and assistance to developing State CCMs participation in WCPFC processes (presently SPC, FFA and PNA).

WCPFC Meeting Server

A valid login is required for each CCM and WCPFC staff

Eastern High Seas Pocket Special Management Area WCPFC VMS data and manual entry and exit reports is in accordance with CMM $2010-02^3$

Direct Data Entry for WCPFC RFV

Login to the WCPFC Record of Fishing Vessels system for CCMs to create and modify their vessel records on the Record of Fishing Vessels. This capability has been available to all CCMs since the RFV SSPs came into force in June 2014. FFA is also given access to the RFV as a duly authorized MCS entity on behalf of some of its members.

Compliance Monitoring Report, Annual Report Part 2 and Online Compliance Case File system

A login to the WCPFC intranet is provided to each CCM to allow them to complete their Annual Report Part 2, enter their reply to their preliminary draft Compliance Monitoring Report and to access relevant cases and submit updates on the status of investigations in the WCPFC Online Compliance Case File System. This login is also used for MTU audit data entry by CCMs.

WCPFC VMS Trackwell system

The VMS SmartTRAC system grants individual logins to users of CCMs whose access is administered by the WCPFC VMS Manager, duly authorized as submitted by their official VMS contact. All authorized logins have the permissions to access the relevant areas in their EEZ, if CCM have 'flicked the switch', and any other areas as previously agreed. Backup support is provided by the WCPFC ICT Manager and escalated to the Trackwell service provider as required.

WCPFC e-Transhipment system development and maintenance – from 1 March 2018

The e-Transhipment project moved from planning to implementation in early March 2018 and was deployed for use by WCPFC staff in November 2018. The project team includes the project manager Mr. Kim Duckworth, and the three SLA partners of WCPFC, namely, BMC of Pohnpei in Micronesia, Taz-e Ltd of Sydney in Australia and Eighty Options of Tasmania in Australia. All individuals involved in the project implementation are granted access to the necessary WCPFC systems and data within their contracts as approved and signed by the Executive Director.
