Thailand requested the Commission for the status of Cooperating Non - Members (CNM) and was accorded in 2010, the participatory rights of Thailand in the WCPO are limited to the provision of carrier and bunker vessels only.

Since 2015, Thailand has reformed the fisheries laws for several sections in order to be consistent with the international regulations and to improve the monitoring, control, and surveillance measures (MCS). These included port-in/port-out control, vessel monitoring system (VMS), reporting of a fishing logbook, observer deployment, and other electronic tools for MCS (E-Reporting System and E-Monitoring System).
