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**Annual Report on the Administration of the WCPFC Data Access Rules and Procedures**

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**WCPFC-TCC22-2026-RP08**

**1 July 2026**

**Submitted by the Secretariat**

**Purpose**

1. This paper provides an update on WCPFC's non-scientific data holdings and their administration by the Secretariat during 2025.

**Key messages**

- a) The Secretariat continues to administer WCPFC non-public domain data through established approval, confidentiality, and record-keeping processes in accordance with the [2007 Data RaP](#) and [2009 MCS Data RaP](#).
- b) In 2025, 122 Data RaP requests were approved, representing an approximately 10% decrease from 2024, but remaining above pre-COVID levels. This indicates that the use of WCPFC data has become an established part of CCM operational MCS activity.
- c) VMS and transshipment-related requests accounted for approximately 90% of all approved requests in 2025, highlighting the operational importance of these datasets for monitoring fishing activities and trends, compliance verification, surveillance planning, and port inspection support and other operational activities.
- d) Requests linked to port State controls, vessel risk assessments, and port CNM access continue to highlight operational and policy questions regarding how Commission data access arrangements support implementation of CMMs such as CMM 2017-02 (Port State Measures), as well as potentially more widely with increasing expectations for timely and near-real time access to MCS activities.
- e) The Secretariat has continued improving access to operational MCS datasets, including through established API access arrangements for VMS and transshipment data, reducing reliance on manual processing and spreadsheet-based data exchanges.
- f) The Secretariat will continue to review streamlining opportunities to improve the transparency, efficiency, and accessibility of data request processes, while maintaining the confidentiality and security standards required under the Commission's data rules and procedures.

**Introduction**

2. The rules categorising data as public or non-public and the administration of such data is governed by the [Rules and Procedures for the Protection, Access to, and Dissemination of Data Compiled by the Commission](#) (2007 data RaP).

3. Additional rules for non-scientific data holdings are in the [Rules and Procedures for the Protection, Access to, and Dissemination of High Seas Non-Public Domain Data and Information Compiled by the Commission for the Purpose of Monitoring, Control or Surveillance \(MCS\) Activities and the Access to and Dissemination of High Seas VMS Data for Scientific Purposes](#) (2009 MCS data RaP). A summary of non-scientific data holdings is in **Annex 1**.<sup>1</sup>
4. Summary details of data requests approved in 2025 are available to CCMs | [List of CCMs non-public domain data requests received and actioned by the Secretariat](#). The list includes filters that allow users to view data by request type and time period.

## Access to WCPFC data holdings

### *Accessing public and non-public domain data*

5. WCPFC's public domain data is accessible through the WCPFC website and via Application Programming Interfaces (APIs), where possible. Where information is not available on the WCPFC website, data requests such as for scientific data, are handled on a case-by-case basis.
6. The Secretariat has an established process for reviewing and deciding on case-by-case requests for access to non-public domain data. All approved data request review forms, related correspondence, and records of data released are maintained in the WCPFC Information Management System (IMS).
7. Secure WCPFC webpages, accessible only to CCMs, contain each CCM's Official Contact details, which are to be maintained by the relevant Party Administrator. The Secretariat uses this information to verify the authority of individuals requesting access to non-public domain data. CCMs should therefore keep their contact details up to date to avoid delays in processing requests.
8. The Secretariat recognises the need to improve the management of data requests, including timely access to data. While VMS data has been available for several years via a Trackwell API, the Secretariat now has an established API for staff and CCMs to access transshipment data, reducing the need for manual data extraction and emailing of spreadsheets.
9. In response to an SC20 meeting outcome,<sup>2</sup> the Secretariat updated the [Guidelines for the Template for SC Project Proposals](#) in 2025 so that proponents of science research projects can identify the WCPFC datasets they expect to be accessed to support the project. A new section in the template allows the WCPFC SSP (SPC-OPF), where possible, to provide comments on the feasibility of providing the requested data in the specified format. Including this information at the time the Scientific Committee (SC) considers whether to approve a research project is expected to enhance transparency around future requests to access non-public domain data for scientific purposes and may also support planning and preparation by the SSP for approved data requests.
10. In response to CCM feedback and ongoing Secretariat efforts to streamline systems and processes, preliminary work in late 2024 and 2025 identified options to improve data request workflows and user support. Proposed improvements include an online tool for CCMs to submit and track requests, supported by guidance materials on data access procedures. These changes aim to make processing more transparent and efficient while reducing the Secretariat's administrative workload.

Progress has been balanced against other Secretariat IMS priorities, including upgraded IT architecture to support geospatial elements of data requests, and upgrades to the WCPFC website and Compliance Monitoring Report system. The Secretariat will continue advancing improvements to data request processes and guidance materials in 2026, as resources and broader system priorities allow.

#### *Who has access to data?*

12. The 2007 data RaP categorises those authorised to access WCPFC data where necessary to perform their duties as:
  - a. WCPFC Secretariat and Service Providers authorised by the Executive Director; and
  - b. Officers of the Commission and its subsidiary bodies.
13. The Secretariat maintains a register of access to all WCPFC non-public domain data.<sup>3</sup> The register records the Secretariat staff positions, Service Providers, and any other individuals given access to this data (refer to **Annex 2 A**). The Secretariat also maintains records of access to individual Commission systems (refer to **Annex 2 B** for a summary of access during 2025/2026). A list of all CCMs that access the WCPFC VMS system is shown in **Annex 3**.
14. Secretariat staff and individuals working with the Secretariat for short periods, such as interns or consultants, are required to sign a confidentiality agreement. Confidentiality provisions are also in the contracts of all WCPFC service providers.

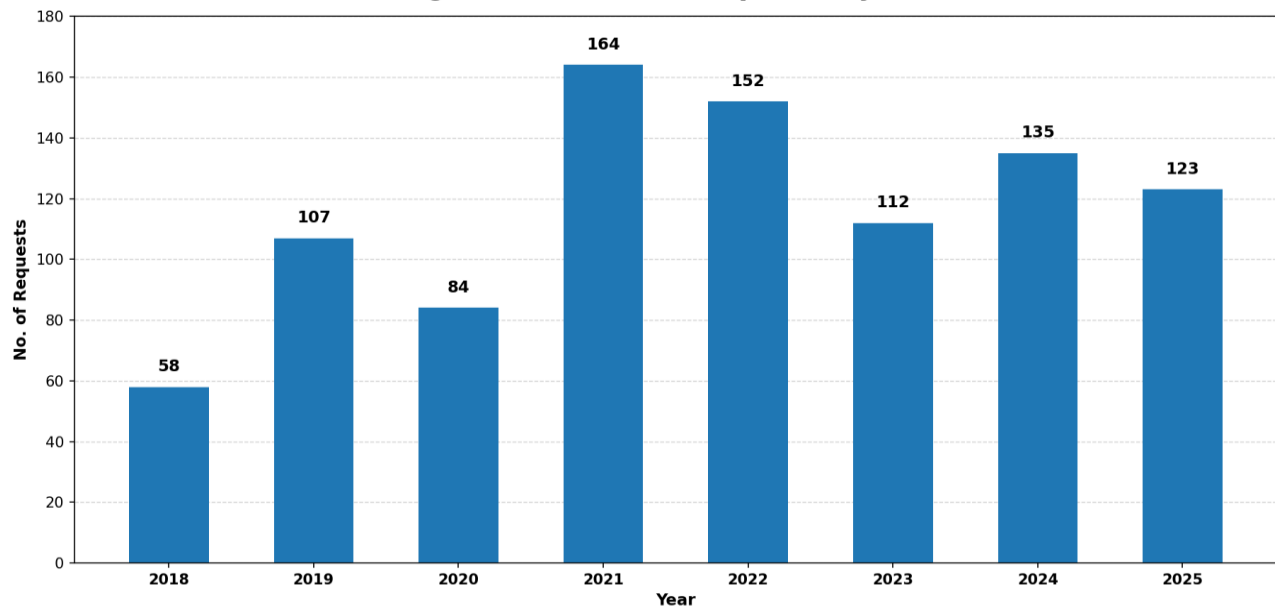
#### *Numbers and types of non-public domain data requests*

15. **Figure 1** shows that 122 data requests were approved in 2025, representing an approximately 10% decrease from 135 in 2024. This reflects the continued stable use of data requests following recovery from the COVID-related low of 84 in 2020, when MCS operations were constrained by port access and restrictions on high seas inspections.
16. Although the 2025 figure remains below the post-COVID peak in 2021 (164) and 2022 (152), the level of requests remains above pre-COVID levels and suggests that the increased use of WCPFC non-public domain data has become embedded in routine CCM MCS operations. This reflects CCMs' continued use of WCPFC data in a more targeted and risk-based way, supported by strengthened analytical capacity and operational adjustments developed during and after the COVID-19 period.

**Figure 1. Data RaP Requests By Year**



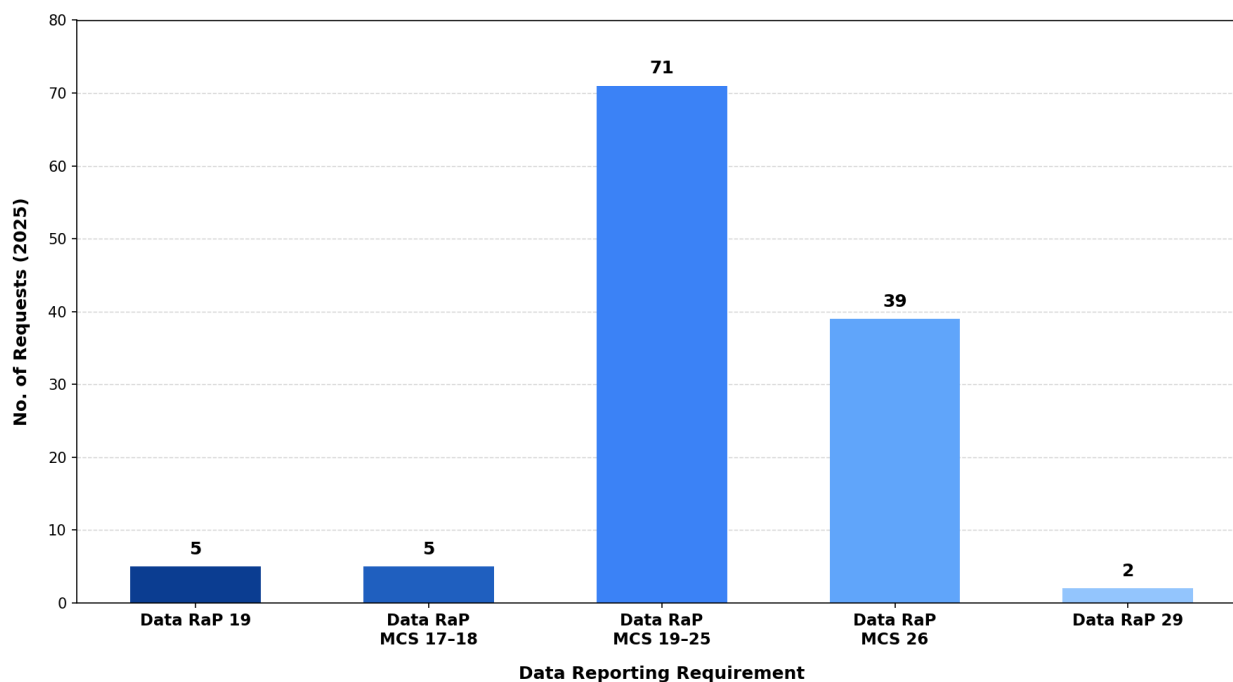
17. **Figure 2** shows the breakdown of the 122 data requests received in 2025, categorised by reporting requirement. The majority of requests were for:

- a) Historical and near real-time high seas VMS data (under Data RaP MCS 19–25): 71 requests (58.2%)
- b) Transshipment reports (under Data RaP MCS 26): 39 requests (approximately 32%)
- c) Access to a CCM’s own data (under Data RaP 19): 5 requests (approximately 4.1%)
- d) High seas boarding and inspection data (under Data RaP MCS 17–18): 5 requests (approximately 4.1%)
- e) Data exchanges with RFMOs or equivalent organisations (under Data RaP 29): 2 requests (approximately 1.6%)

18. Compared with 2024, when 135 requests were submitted, including 69 for VMS data and 49 for transshipment reports, the 2025 data show a modest decline in overall request volume while the distribution of requests remains broadly consistent. VMS requests increased slightly in absolute terms, while transshipment requests decreased but continued to account for a significant proportion of approved requests.

19. Together, VMS and transshipment-related requests accounted for approximately 90% of all approved requests in 2025. This indicates that these data streams remain central to CCM operational MCS work, particularly for monitoring high seas fishing and transshipment operations, supporting compliance verification, surveillance planning, and port inspection activities.

20. The Secretariat's 2024 report on the administration of data rules noted a rise in requests for high seas vessel activity data during 2023, particularly to support port CCM reviews of entry applications and inspections of foreign-flagged vessels. This trend was less pronounced in 2024, and 2025 requests relate to "Vessels of Interest", which are typically made within the scope of a single approved data request and consequently are not recorded as a distinct "data request".
21. At WCPFC21, the Commission tasked an intersessional Working Group to Review [CMM 2017-02](#) on Port State Minimum Standards (PSMWG) in response to issues raised by CNMs relating to access to non-public domain data.<sup>4</sup> The PSMWG was tasked to review the linkage between CMM 2017-02 and the MCS data rules in its review of that CMM, including with respect to the potential for CNMs to access MCS data. Discussions at [PSMWG02](#)<sup>5</sup> and [PSMWG03](#)<sup>6</sup> identified the importance of timely data request processes as well as the need for near-real-time access to Commission data to support vessel risk assessments and port inspection activities. CCMs also discussed the interpretation of existing data rules and procedures and the potential development of new mechanisms to access data including secure web-based access to specified data views or explicit data access provisions within a revised CMM 2017-02. The Working Group agreed that further Secretariat analysis and the development of draft recommendation text would be undertaken as part of the ongoing review of CMM 2017-02.
